This exception would apply to both 15 freshwater and saltwater fishing licenses. 16 17 A BTTT TO BE ENTITLED 18 19 AN ACT 20 21 To amend Sections 9-11-53 and 9-11-53.1 of the Code 22 of Alabama 1975, relating to fishing licenses; to provide that 23 members of a high school fishing team are exempt from 24 freshwater or saltwater fishing license requirements if under 25 the direct supervision of the fishing coach. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 26

Section 1. Sections 9-11-53 and 9-11-53.1 of the
 Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
 "\$9-11-53.

"(a) Any person who has been a bona fide resident of 4 5 this state for a period of not less than 90 days next 6 preceding and who is age 16 or older, but who has not yet 7 reached the age of 65, shall not take, catch, kill or attempt to take, catch, or kill any fish in any of the waters of this 8 state above that line defined in Rule 220-2-.42 (1) of the 9 10 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources as published in the Alabama Administrative Code, as well as below that line 11 12 in any of the ponds or lakes containing freshwater fish, 13 subject to the exceptions contained herein, by any means, 14 except designated commercial fishing gear and wire baskets, 15 expressly allowed by law or regulation without first procuring an annual resident freshwater fishing license and paying 16 17 therefor the sum of eleven dollars (\$11), plus a one dollar 18 (\$1) issuance fee, which fees shall be subject to adjustment as provided for in Section 9-11-68; provided, however, that 19 20 U.S. military veterans otherwise meeting the requirements of 21 this section who are certified by the U.S. Veterans 22 Administration as 20 percent or more disabled shall be 23 entitled to purchase an alternative license to the annual 24 resident freshwater fishing license to be known as the 25 disabled military veterans appreciation fishing license for a license fee of two dollars (\$2) plus a one dollar (\$1) 26 issuance fee. All persons making application for the license 27

1 provided for in this section shall present a valid Alabama 2 driver license, or in the case of nondrivers, proof of permanent residence. All licenses required by this section 3 shall bear the Alabama driver license number of the licensee, 4 5 except in the case of nondrivers and active duty military personnel stationed in Alabama and their spouses and 6 7 dependents who reside with them, and all licenses shall bear 8 proof of residence as required by the Commissioner of 9 Conservation and Natural Resources. Notwithstanding the 10 foregoing, a member of the United States military stationed in Alabama on active duty, and his or her spouse and their 11 dependents who reside with them, shall be deemed Alabama 12 13 residents for the purpose of procuring this license. Active 14 duty military personnel stationed in Alabama and their spouses 15 and dependents who reside with them shall provide military 16 orders that assign them to Alabama. These licenses shall be 17 issued in the manner and under the conditions, limitations, 18 and exemptions as expressly provided for in this section. Persons obtaining the annual resident freshwater fishing 19 20 license shall also be entitled to all of the privileges of the 21 wildlife heritage license.

"(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any resident 64 years of age procuring a resident freshwater fishing license pursuant to this section shall be issued the license on a lifetime basis. License fees from the sale of a lifetime license pursuant to this subsection to a resident age 64 years shall be deposited to the credit of the Alabama Game
 and Fish Endowment Fund within the Game and Fish Fund.

3 "(c) A fishing license shall not be transferable,
4 and it shall be unlawful to borrow, lend, or alter any fishing
5 license, or for any license-issuing officer to falsify any
6 license at the time of issuing the license. A violation of
7 this subsection shall constitute a Class B misdemeanor
8 punishable as provided by law.

9 "(d) Any citizen of this state who is entitled to 10 purchase a fishing license as provided for in this section may procure a license by applying to any judge of probate, license 11 12 commissioner, or other persons authorized and designated to 13 issue fishing licenses, stating his or her name, age, place of residence, and post office address, and paying to the issuing 14 15 officer the amount required in this section for the license. Judges of probate, license commissioners, or other persons 16 17 authorized and designated to issue fishing licenses shall be 18 entitled to the issuance fee set out herein for each license so issued, which fee shall be in addition to the amount 19 20 designated in this section as the cost of the license. All 21 fees collected by any judge of probate or license commissioner who is paid a salary for the performance of his or her duties 22 23 shall be paid into the county treasury to the credit of the 24 appropriate fund.

"(e) All persons under the age of 16 years shall be
exempted from the requirement of procuring a license. Any
resident of this state 65 years of age and older shall be

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exempted from the requirement of procuring a fishing license as provided for in this section, provided that the resident has on his or her person while fishing, a valid Alabama driver license, or, in the case of nondrivers, proof of permanent Alabama residence and age.

6 "(f) Every person who obtains an annual resident 7 freshwater fishing license without presenting a valid Alabama 8 driver license, or in the case of nondrivers, proof of 9 permanent residence, or who provides any false information in 10 the process of procuring the license, shall be guilty of a 11 Class B misdemeanor punishable as provided by law.

"(g) The licenses required by this section shall not 12 13 apply to a resident of this state on active military duty who is in this state on leave and who has proof of that status in 14 15 his or her possession, nor to any person who fishes in a private pond. The license required by this section shall not 16 17 apply to any person fishing from the bank with an ordinary 18 hook and line in his or her county of residence. A person who fishes from the bank with ordinary hook and line in his or her 19 20 own county of residence shall be required to have on his or 21 her person, while so fishing, a reasonable proof of residency 22 in the county. In addition, the licenses required by this 23 section shall not apply to persons exempt from fishing license 24 requirements while fishing at commercial fee fishing ponds 25 pursuant to the provisions of Article 17 of this chapter.

26 "(h) The licenses required by this section do not
27 apply to a member of a public or private high school fishing

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1 <u>team fishing under the direct supervision of the school's</u>
2 <u>fishing coach.</u>

"(h) (i) The revenue derived from the sale of the 3 license provided for in this section shall be remitted to the 4 5 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources on the first day of each month by the issuing officer and shall be 6 7 deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the Game and Fish Fund and shall be used in the construction, 8 9 maintenance, development, and supervision of public fishing 10 lakes, for the purchase of lands to be used for public landings on public streams and for the development, 11 12 protection, propagation, and distribution of fish and wildlife 13 of this state.

14 "(i) (j) Except as otherwise provided in this 15 section, any person who violates this section shall be guilty 16 of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 17 punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor 18 more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for each offense.

19 "(j) (k) There shall be provided on the license form 20 for the licenses provided for in this section a check-off 21 option whereby the licensee may voluntarily choose to donate 22 an additional one dollar (\$1) to the Division of Wildlife and 23 Freshwater Fisheries for the purpose of research on fisheries 24 and aquatic habitat as approved by the Advisory Board of 25 Conservation and Natural Resources.

1 "(a) Any person who has been a bona fide resident of 2 this state for a period of not less than 90 days next preceding and who is age 16 or older, but has not yet reached 3 the age of 65, shall not take, catch, kill, possess, or 4 5 attempt to take, catch, kill, or possess, any fish in any of the waters of this state (except those waters for which a 6 7 license is required by Section 9-11-53) below that line defined in Rule 220-2-.42(1) of the Department of Conservation 8 9 and Natural Resources as published in the Alabama 10 Administrative Code, by angling with rod and reel or by use of any artificial bait, fly, lure, gig, cast net, bow, crab traps 11 that are not required to be licensed by Section 9-12-124, or 12 13 by spear fishing, as defined by Section 9-11-170, without first procuring an annual resident saltwater fishing license 14 15 for twenty dollars (\$20), plus a one dollar (\$1) issuance fee, which fees shall be subject to adjustment as provided for in 16 17 Section 9-11-69. All persons making application for the 18 license provided for in this section shall present an Alabama driver license or, in the case of nondrivers, proof of 19 20 permanent residence. All licenses required by this section 21 shall bear the driver license number of the licensee, except in the case of nondrivers, and all licenses shall bear proof 22 23 of residence as required by the Commissioner of Conservation 24 and Natural Resources. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a member 25 of the United States military stationed in Alabama on active 26 duty, and his or her spouse and their dependents who reside with them, shall be deemed to be Alabama residents for the 27

1 purposes of procuring this license. This license shall not be 2 required of any person who has been issued and is the holder of any valid lifetime fishing license that is provided for in 3 Section 9-11-65, provided that such license was issued on or 4 before March 31, 1992, or any valid lifetime saltwater fishing 5 license that is provided for in Section 9-11-65.2. This 6 7 saltwater fishing license shall not be required of permanent Alabama residents under 16 years of age or age 65 years or 8 9 over, provided, however, that residents age 65 years or older 10 shall be required to have in their actual possession, while fishing, an Alabama driver license, or in the case of 11 nondrivers, proof of permanent Alabama residence and age. The 12 13 revenue derived from the sale of the license provided for in this section shall be remitted to the Department of 14 15 Conservation and Natural Resources on the first day of each month by the issuing officer and shall be covered into the 16 17 State Treasury to the credit of the Marine Resources Fund and 18 shall be used in the research, management, and development of saltwater fisheries. It shall be unlawful to provide false 19 20 information in the process of obtaining the license.

"(b) The licenses required by this section do not
 apply to a member of a public or private high school fishing
 team fishing under the direct supervision of the school's
 fishing coach.

"(b) (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
 any resident 64 years of age who procures a resident saltwater
 fishing license pursuant to this section shall be issued the

license on a lifetime basis. The license fees from the sale of
 a lifetime license pursuant to this subsection shall be
 deposited to the credit of the Alabama Marine Resources
 Endowment Fund within the Marine Resources Fund.

5 "(c) (d) Any person who violates any of the 6 provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 7 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of 8 not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred 9 fifty dollars (\$250) for each offense."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
