198279-1:n:04/02/2019:KBH/ma LSA2019-1022 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 Under existing law, the Department of 8 SYNOPSIS: Conservation and Natural Resources may issue 9 10 military veterans appreciation freshwater fishing 11 licenses for military veterans who are 20 percent 12 or more disabled for a nominal fee, and may 13 sanction a disabled three-day freshwater fishing 14 license for up to 20 disabled residents or 15 nonresidents and their assistants, per event. 16 This bill would authorize the Department of 17 Conservation and Natural Resources to issue 18 military veterans appreciation saltwater fishing 19 licenses to veterans who are 20 percent or more 20 disabled for a nominal fee, would authorize a 21 check-off option for persons obtaining the

22 saltwater fishing licenses to donate an additional 23 one dollar to the Division of Marine Resources for 24 the purposes of research on fisheries and aquatic 25 habitat, and would authorize the department to 26 issue three-day saltwater fishing event licenses to 27 disabled persons.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 1 2 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 3 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 4 5 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from 6 7 becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 8 unless: it comes within one of a number of 9 10 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 11 12 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 13 the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

A BILL A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT AN ACT To amend Section 9-11-53.1, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to saltwater fishing licenses; to authorize the

1 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to issue 2 military veterans appreciation saltwater fishing licenses to certain veterans for a nominal fee; to add Section 9-11-56.5 3 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to authorize the Department of 4 5 Conservation and Natural Resources to issue three-day saltwater fishing event licenses to disabled persons; and in 6 7 connection therewith to have as its purpose or effect the 8 requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds 9 within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of 10 Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, 11 12 as amended.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 9-11-53.1, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

"§9-11-53.1.

17 "(a)(1) Any person who has been a bona fide resident 18 of this state for a period of not less than 90 days next 19 preceding and who is age 16 or older, but has not yet reached 20 the age of 65, shall not take, catch, kill, possess, or 21 attempt to take, catch, kill, or possess, any fish in any of the waters of this state, (except those waters for which a 22 23 license is required by Section 9-11-53+, below that line 24 defined in Rule 220-2-.42(1) of the Department of Conservation 25 and Natural Resources as published in the Alabama 26 Administrative Code, by angling with rod and reel or by use of 27 any artificial bait, fly, lure, gig, cast net, bow, crab traps

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that are not required to be licensed by Section 9-12-124, or by spear fishing, as defined by Section 9-11-170, without first procuring an annual resident saltwater fishing license for twenty dollars (\$20), plus a one dollar (\$1) issuance fee, which fees shall be subject to adjustment as provided for in Section 9-11-69.

7 "(2) A United States military veteran otherwise 8 meeting the requirements of this section who is certified by 9 the United States Veterans Administration as 20 percent or 10 more disabled may purchase an alternative license to the annual resident saltwater fishing license, to be known as the 11 12 disabled military veterans appreciation saltwater fishing 13 license, for a license fee and issuance fee equivalent to that 14 charged for a disabled military veterans appreciation freshwater fishing license pursuant to Section 9-11-53, 15 16 subject to the cost adjustments provided for in Section 17 9-11-69.

18 "<u>(3)a.</u> All persons making application for the 19 license provided for in this section shall present an Alabama 20 driver license, or, in the case of nondrivers, proof of 21 permanent residence.

22 "<u>b.</u> All licenses required by this section shall bear 23 the driver license number of the licensee, except in the case 24 of nondrivers, and all licenses shall bear proof of residence 25 as required by the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural 26 Resources. 1 "<u>c.</u> Notwithstanding the foregoing, a member of the 2 United States military stationed in Alabama on active duty, 3 and his or her spouse and their dependents who reside with 4 them, shall be deemed to be Alabama residents for the purposes 5 of procuring this license.

6 "<u>(4)a. This A saltwater fishing</u> license shall not be 7 required of any person who has been issued and is the holder 8 of any valid lifetime fishing license that is provided for in 9 Section 9-11-65, provided that such license was issued on or 10 before March 31, 1992, or any valid lifetime saltwater fishing 11 license that is provided for in Section 9-11-65.2.

12 "<u>b. This A</u> saltwater fishing license shall not be 13 required of permanent Alabama residents under 16 years of age 14 or age 65 years or over, provided, however, that residents age 15 65 years or older shall be required to have in their actual 16 possession, while fishing, an Alabama driver license, or in 17 the case of nondrivers, proof of permanent Alabama residence 18 and age.

"(5) The revenue derived from the sale of the 19 20 license provided for in this section shall be remitted to the 21 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources on the first 22 day of each month by the issuing officer and shall be covered 23 into the State Treasury to the credit of the Marine Resources 24 Fund and shall be used in the research, management, and 25 development of saltwater fisheries. It shall be unlawful to 26 provide false information in the process of obtaining the 27 license.

"(b)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 1 2 any resident 64 years of age who procures a resident saltwater fishing license pursuant to this section shall be issued the 3 license on a lifetime basis. The license fees from the sale of 4 5 a lifetime license pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited to the credit of the Alabama Marine Resources 6 7 Endowment Fund within the Marine Resources Fund. "(c) (2) Any person who violates any of the 8 9 provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 10 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred 11 fifty dollars (\$250) for each offense. 12 13 "(c) There shall be provided on the license form for 14 the licenses provided for in this section a check-off option 15 whereby the licensee may voluntarily choose to donate an additional one dollar (\$1) to the Division of Marine Resources 16 for the purpose of research on fisheries and aquatic habitat 17 18 as approved by the Advisory Board of Conservation and Natural Resources." 19 20 Section 2. Section 9-11-56.5 is added to the Code of 21 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§9-11-56.5.

(a) Effective with the license year beginning
September 1, 2019, there shall be a disabled three-day
saltwater fishing event license, for events sanctioned by the
Commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural
Resources.

1 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section for 2 additional persons, the license shall permit up to 20 disabled residents or nonresidents, plus up to 20 resident and 3 nonresident assistants, in the numbers as determined to be 4 5 reasonably necessary by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, to purchase the license as an alternative 6 7 to any recreational saltwater fishing license otherwise applicable under this chapter, which shall permit the persons, 8 for a period not to exceed 72 consecutive hours, to engage in 9 10 those same activities as the holders of the annual saltwater fishing license in Section 9-11-53.1. 11

12 (c) The license fee shall be one hundred dollars13 (\$100).

(d) Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c), any
additional disabled persons over the 20-person limit shall be
charged an additional five dollars (\$5) per person, which
amount, subject to the approval of the Department of
Conservation and Natural Resources, may include an additional
assistant.

20 Section 3. Although this bill would have as its 21 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 22 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 23 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 24 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 25 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 26 27 existing crime.

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Section 4. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
