Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section 13A-8-18, Code of Alabama 1975, to include additional activity that would constitute the crime of receiving stolen property in the second degree; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-8-18, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

15 "\$13A-8-18.

- "(a) Receiving Any of the following constitutes receiving stolen property in the second degree:
- "(1) Which Receiving stolen property which is between one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) in value and two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) in value; or.
- "(2) Of Receiving stolen property of any value under
 the circumstances described in subdivision (b)(3) of Section
 13A-8-16; constitutes receiving stolen property in the second
 degree.

1	"(3) Receiving stolen property that is a firearm,
2	rifle, or shotgun, regardless of its value.
3	"(b) Receiving stolen property in the second degree
4	is a Class C felony."
5	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its
6	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
7	expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further
8	requirements and application under Amendment 621, now
9	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of
10	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the
11	bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
12	existing crime.
13	Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
14	first day of the third month following its passage and
15	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
