Section 22-11B-2, Code of Alabama 1975, 4 is amended to read as follows: 5 "§22-11B-2. 6 7 Pursuant to and in furtherance of the purposes of 8 this chapter, the State Board of Health is authorized to may 9 create and maintain an immunization registry. The immunization 10 registry is the central collection of data and reports 11 concerning a vaccine dose or doses administered to a person by 12 a provider records on vaccines administered to all ages, 13 including historical records of vaccinations. The nature of the immunization information contained in this registry shall 14 15 be determined by rule of the State Board of Health and shall be obtained from clinic records, billing data and information, 16 17 and vital or any other records owned and controlled by the 18 State Board of Health and the Alabama Medicaid Agency. Medical 19 insurers and public and private providers are authorized and 20 encouraged to provide information to the registry. In the 21 absence of a bi-directional interface with the registry to send current or retrieve historical records of vaccination 22 administrations, all providers shall review the registry 23 24 before a vaccine is administered and provide all vaccine data 25 through electronic interface or manual entry in the registry. If the provider is using a bi-directional electronic 26 interface, the provider shall review the information in and 27

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1	enter the information in the bi-directional interface or the
2	information shall otherwise be entered in the registry. Annual
3	influenza vaccinations shall be reported to the registry, but
4	a review of the registry is not required prior to the
5	administration of a vaccine to an adult 19 years or older."
6	Section 2. This act shall become effective
7	immediately following its passage and approval by the
8	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
