19	To amend Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, as
20	last amended by Act 2018-527, 2018 Regular Session; to
21	stipulate that the birthday of Robert E. Lee is celebrated
22	annually on the fourth Monday in April.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, as
25	last amended by Act 2018-527, 2018 Regular Session, is amended
26	to read as follows:
27	"§1-3-8.

"(a) Sunday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Martin 1 2 Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's birthday, George Washington's birthday, Thomas Jefferson's birthday, 3 Confederate Memorial Day, National Memorial Day, Jefferson 4 5 Davis' birthday, the Fourth day of July, Labor Day, Columbus Day and Fraternal Day, Veterans' Day, American Indian Heritage 6 7 Day, and the day designated by the Governor for public thanksgiving shall each be deemed a holiday. If any holiday 8 9 falls on Sunday, the following day is the holiday. If any 10 holiday falls on Saturday, the preceding day is the holiday. Veterans' Day shall be observed by the closing of all state, 11 county, and municipal offices, all banks located within this 12 13 state, and the public schools on such day. Public schools, grades K to 12, inclusive, and all public two-year 14 15 institutions of higher education shall also be closed on National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be applicable to 16 17 all students and non-essential employees. The Superintendent 18 of Banks, with the concurrence of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may authorize any state bank to close 19 20 on National Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, and on such 21 other days as may be declared by the Governor to be state 22 holidays in honor of a special event. If any authorized state 23 holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may 24 authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday. 25 The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at 26 12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day prior to New Year's Day, if such days fall on business days. 27

"(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, 1 2 the following shall be observed on the dates herein 3 prescribed: "(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in 4 5 January. "(2)(1) George Washington's birthday - the third 6 7 Monday in February. "(3)(2) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday 8 9 in April. 10 "(3) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the fourth Monday in 11 April. "(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in 12 13 June. 14 "(5) Columbus Day and Fraternal Day - the second 15 Monday in October. 16 "(6) Veterans' Day - the eleventh day of November. "(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third 17 18 Monday in January. "(8) National Memorial Day - the last Monday in May. 19 20 "(9) Thomas Jefferson's birthday - the third Monday 21 in February. 22 "(10) American Indian Heritage Day - the second 23 Monday in October. 24 "(c) In addition to the legal holidays provided 25 above, Mardi Gras shall be deemed a holiday in Mobile and Baldwin Counties and all state offices shall be closed in 26 those counties on Mardi Gras. 27

"(d) In addition to the legal holidays provided 1 2 above all state employees, except those employed in Baldwin and Mobile Counties, shall be granted one personal leave day 3 per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on January 1 4 5 of each year. All state employees employed in Baldwin and 6 Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave day. All 7 such personal leave days granted in any year shall be used by the end of the calendar year. All such personal leave days 8 shall be scheduled during the year with the approval of the 9 10 supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave days for employees shall justify that action in writing to the 11 Director of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay 12 13 at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 14 15 31 of each year.

16 "(e) All state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open 17 18 on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in 19 20 advance of the holiday. Provided, that However, any state 21 office may be opened in the event of an emergency and the 22 State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the openings of state offices needing to be open on holidays on a 23 24 regular basis for essential services. Any state employee 25 working on a state holiday shall receive a day of compensatory 26 leave or paid compensation in lieu of the holiday as provided herein. 27

"(f) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 1 2 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the supervisor, 3 4 during the quarter that the regularly scheduled holiday 5 occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory leave day may 6 7 be accumulated at the request of the employee for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule compensatory leave days 8 for employees within the quarter, unless the day is carried 9 10 forward at the request of the employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel and the 11 employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the 12 13 employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any 14 compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled 15 and which has not been taken.

16 "(g)(1) The first day in December of each year is designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All 17 18 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of 19 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of 20 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love, 21 and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement 22 on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is 23 24 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.

"(2) Each county and municipality may elect to
observe Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
