Section 1. Section 36-26-35, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

6	maximum number of hours of sick leave which may be carried
7	over at the end of each year shall be limited to 1,550 hours."
8	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
9	first day of the third month following its passage and
10	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
