BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 13 14 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited 15 as the Alabama Alzheimer's and Dementia Education, Care and 16 Training Act. 17 Section 2. The purposes of this act are: 18 (1) To enable Alabamians with Alzheimer's disease, 19 dementia, or related diseases to live with dignity in their 20 homes or community for as long as possible. 21 (2) To develop services that follow individuals with 22 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases and 23 maintain their independence in the community.

1 (3) To provide appropriate services for Alabamians 2 with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases residing in both rural and urban settings. 3 (4) To emphasize and implement cost-efficient, 4 5 low-technology, high-yield services that can currently benefit 6 thousands of Alabama citizens. (5) To allow Alabamians to pay for services based on 7 their individual resources. 8 Section 3. (a) Subject to Section 5, the Department 9 10 of Public Health is authorized to develop educational programs 11 and services concerning Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and 12 related diseases. These programs and services shall be offered 13 to individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related 14 diseases, the families of these individuals, and the general public. 15 16 (b) (1) The department may provide instructors to 17 train and provide support to each of the following:

18 a. Members of the families of individuals with19 Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases.

20 b. Health care providers who provide care for 21 individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar 22 diseases at the home of the individual or a member of the 23 family of the individual, or a similar residential location.
