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2 Relating to the Joint Legislative Prison Oversight Committee; to amend Section 29-2-20, Code of Alabama 1975, to 3 add members to the committee; to require the committee to make 4 5 annual reports to the Legislature; to require the committee to meet quarterly and review reports submitted by the Department 6 of Corrections; to require the department to adopt certain 7 screening measures; and to require the department to establish 8 a centralized electronic system on inmate deaths. 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Section 29-2-20, Code of Alabama 1975, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 13 "§29-2-20. 14 "(a)(1) A permanent legislative committee, known as 15 the Joint Legislative Prison Oversight Committee, which shall be composed of eight members, two of whom shall be ex officio 16 17 members and six of whom shall be appointed members, three each 18 to be appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of 19 the House, who shall both serve as the ex officio members, 20 shall be formed to assist in realizing implementing the 21 recommendations of the Legislative Prison Task Force and examine all aspects of the operations of the Department of 22 23 Corrections. The committee shall be composed of 10 members. 24 The chairman chair of the committee shall be selected by and 25 from among the membership. The committee shall make diligent inquiry and a full examination of Alabama's present and long 26 27 term prison needs and they shall file reports of their

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1	findings and recommendations to the Alabama Legislature not
2	later than the fifteenth legislative day of each regular
3	session that the committee continues to exist. <u>The members</u>
4	shall be as follows:
5	"a. The President of the Senate as an ex officio
6	member.
7	"b. The Speaker of the House of Representatives as
8	<u>an ex officio member.</u>
9	"c. The chair of the Finance Taxation General Fund

25	term of imprisonment in order to streamline the sharing of
26	critical mental health information and in order to address
27	barriers to accessing mental health treatment for such

1 "(d) The committee shall study and address capacity 2 issues within the Department of Corrections to include, but be 3 not limited to, the issue of design capacity and operational or functional capacity, as well as the construction of new 4 5 prison facilities and the renovation of current correctional facilities as they relate to prison overcrowding and public 6 7 safety. "(14) Two members from the Alabama District 1 2 Attorneys Association, of which one shall be from a largely populated metropolitan judicial circuit and the other shall be 3 from a small, rurally populated judicial circuit. 4 5 "(e) The committee shall meet at least quarterly at the State House or other places as deemed necessary or 6 7 convenient and at other times upon call of the chair. 8 "(e) (f) The studies and collaborating partners 9 provided for in this section shall reflect the racial, gender, 10 geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state." Section 2. (a) The Department of Corrections shall 11 12 provide a quarterly report to the Joint Legislative Prison 13 Oversight Committee, on a form prescribed by the committee, which shall include all of the following: 14 15 (1) A summary of any litigation involving the 16 department. 17 (2) All sexual assault cases occurring in a 18 correctional facility. (3) All inmate deaths, including the cause and 19 20 manner of death as determined by the Alabama Department of 21 Forensic Sciences. (4) The number of contraband collected. 22 23 (5) The number of weapons collected. 24 (6) Any other information requested by the committee. 25 (b)(1) The Commissioner of the Department of 26 Corrections shall require the warden of each prison to provide 27

1 monthly reports to him or her containing the information
2 required in subsection (a).

3 (2) Failure of a warden to maintain or file reports
4 as required by this section shall be considered deliberate
5 misconduct and shall subject him or her to discipline by the
6 commissioner.

Section 3. (a) The Department of Corrections shall
screen every individual who enters a correctional facility,
including, but not limited to staff, visitors, volunteers, and
new inmates to the correctional facility.

11 (b) The department shall adopt rules to govern the 12 implementation of this section.

13 Section 4. By October 1, 2019, the Department of 14 Corrections, in coordination with the Alabama Department of 15 Forensic Sciences, shall develop a centralized electronic 16 system that contains information, including autopsy reports, 17 on all inmates who die in the Department of Correction's 18 custody.

Section 5. This act shall become effective
 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
