7 "(1) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009,

 under pursuant to this article shall not exceed ten million
 dollars (\$10,000,000) for all qualified production companies.

19 "<u>(4)</u> For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013, 20 the aggregate cap of incentives granted under <u>pursuant to</u> this 21 article shall not exceed fifteen million dollars 22 (\$15,000,000).

"(5) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014,
the aggregate cap of incentives granted under pursuant to this
article shall not exceed fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000)
and for all subsequent fiscal years thereafter ending
September 30, 2015, September 30, 2016, September 30, 2017,

1	and September 30, 2018, the aggregate cap of incentives
