| 23 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:                |
| 24 | Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares as            |
| 25 | follows:  |

(1) Our nation currently faces an immediate public
 health crisis stemming from the rapid spread of communicable
 diseases.

4 (2) Many of these diseases are preventable due to 5 the wide availability of vaccinations and the advancement of 6 modern medicine.

7 (3) In order to combat the spread of communicable
8 diseases, citizens of this state should be vigilant about
9 shielding themselves from those diseases through all available
10 means.

(4) Although comprehensive vaccinations against communicable diseases is the best way to combat many of these diseases, some citizens have opted out of receiving vaccinations.

15 (5) Therefore, all citizens of this state, including 16 students in public or private schools, who are medically able 17 to receive vaccinations for the most dangerous communicable 18 diseases should do so for the betterment of the overall health 19 of this state.

20 Section 2. Section 16-30-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is 21 amended to read as follows:

22 "§16-30-3.

23 "The provisions of this chapter shall not apply if:
24 (1) In the absence of an epidemic or immediate threat thereof,
25 the parent or guardian of the child shall object thereto in
26 writing on grounds that such immunization or testing conflicts
27 with his religious tenets and practices; or (2) Certification

1 <u>certification</u> by a competent medical authority providing 2 individual exemption from the required immunization or testing 3 <u>for the child for a medical reason</u> is presented <u>to</u> the 4 admissions officer of the school."

5 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 6 first day of the third month following its passage and 7 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
