18	Section 1. Sections 45-3-233.01 and 45-3-233.02,
19	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

21	"(a) In addition to all existing charges, fees,
22	judgments, and costs of court, the clerk, sheriff, or other
23	appropriate court official in the civil division of the
24	district and circuit courts of Barbour County shall increase
25	the fees by fifteen dollars (\$15) per document personally
26	served by the sheriff's office, or its designee. For purposes

of this part the term document shall include multiple papers
served on a party or entity at one time.

3 "(b) The court official designated in Barbour County 4 by law for the respective courts shall collect the additional 5 service of process fee designated in subsection (a) and remit 6 the fees collected to the Barbour County Commission General 7 Fund for deposit in the fund to Sheriff's Fund maintained by 8 the sheriff or his or her designee and the funds may be 9 expended for law enforcement purposes.

11 "The Barbour County Commission Sheriff, at his or 12 <u>her discretion</u>, may use the monies generated by this part for 13 law enforcement purposes in Barbour County, including 14 contracting with or entering into a contract or agreement with 15 a private, public, or governmental entity for service of 16 process of documents from the civil or criminal division of 17 the district or circuit court."

18 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 19 first day of the first month following its passage and 20 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
