17		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
18		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
19		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
20		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
21		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
22		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
23		becoming effective with regard to a local
24		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
25		unless: it comes within one of a number of
26		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
27		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 1 2 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased 3 expenditure of local funds within the meaning of 4 5 the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or 6 enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions 8 9 contained in the amendment.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 5 Section 1. Sections 3-9-1, 3-9-2, and 3-9-3, Code of
- Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 "\$3-9-1.
- 8 "As used in this chapter, the following words shall
- 9 have the following meanings:
- "(1) ANIMAL SHELTER. Any facility operated by or
- 11 under contract for the state or any county, municipal
- 12 corporation, or other political subdivision of the state for
- the purpose of impounding or harboring seized, stray,
- homeless, abandoned, or unwanted dogs, cats, and other
- animals; any veterinary hospital or clinic operated by a

- in addition to its customary purposes; and any facility
- 18 operated, owned, or maintained by a duly incorporated humane
- 19 society, animal welfare organization, or other nonprofit
- 20 organization for the purpose of providing for and promoting

- "(2) ANIMAL WELFARE ORGANIZATION. Any unincorporated
- 23 nonprofit organization or business entity existing for
- fostering and adopting dogs and cats by the public.
- 25 "(3) SEXUALLY MATURE ANIMAL. Any dog or cat that has
- reached the age of 180 days.

"(4) STERILIZATION. The surgical removal of the reproductive organs of a dog or cat in order to render the animal unable to reproduce.

"§3-9-2.

- "(a) Any public or private animal shelter, animal control agency operated by a political subdivision of this state, animal welfare organization, animal rescue, or humane society shall make provisions for the sterilization of all dogs or cats acquired from a shelter, agency, animal welfare organization, animal rescue, or humane society by providing for all of the following:
- "(1) Sterilization by a licensed veterinarian  $\underline{\text{of all}}$   $\underline{\text{dogs or cats } 180 \text{ days or older}}$  before relinquishing custody of the animal.
- "(2) Entering into a A written agreement to be made, prior to the relinquishment of custody of an animal that is less than 180 days old, with the a person acquiring the animal guaranteeing to guarantee that sterilization will be performed by a licensed veterinarian either within 30 days after acquisition of the animal, or within or 30 days of the sexual maturity of an animal.
- "(b) The requirements of this chapter shall not apply to any privately owned animal in possession of a shelter, agency, animal welfare organization, animal rescue, or humane society if the owner of the animal claims or presents evidence that the animal is the property of that person.

"(c) All costs of sterilization pursuant to this chapter shall be the responsibility of the person acquiring the animal, and if sterilization is performed prior to acquisition, may be included in any fees charged by the shelter, agency, animal welfare organization, animal rescue, or humane society for an animal.

"(d) Any person acquiring an animal from a public or private animal shelter, animal control agency operated by a political subdivision of this state, or humane society, animal welfare organization, or animal rescue, from which an animal is not sterile at the time of acquisition, shall submit to the animal shelter, animal control agency, humane society, or public or private animal shelter animal welfare organization, or animal rescue a signed statement from the licensed veterinarian attesting that a sterilization procedure has been performed by the veterinarian within seven days after the sterilization.

"§3-9-3.

"It shall be a misdemeanor to fail or refuse to comply with this chapter. Any person, animal shelter, animal control agency, animal welfare organization, humane society, or animal rescue failing or refusing to comply shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of a minimum of fifty dollars (\$50) three hundred dollars (\$300) and not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) one thousand dollars (\$1,000)."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 1 2 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 3 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 4 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 5 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 7 existing crime. 8 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 10 first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
