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8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a parent or guardian of 9 a student with diabetes who seeks care for the 10 student while the student is at school must submit 11 an individual health plan to provide guidance to 12 school officials on the student's care.

This bill would provide that a parent or guardian of a student with a seizure disorder may seek care for the student while the student is at school or participating in a school-sponsored activity by submitting a seizure management and treatment plan to the local board of education.

19This bill would also require a school nurse20employed by a local board of education and a school21employee, other than a school nurse, whose job22duties include regular contact with students to23complete an online training course approved by the24State Board of Education on seizure disorders.

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. This act may be known and cited as Sam's

15	Section 2. Chapter 30C is added to Title 16, Code of
16	Alabama 1975, commencing with Section 16-30C-1, to read as
17	follows:

19	(a) The parent or guardian of a student with a
20	seizure disorder, enrolled in and attending a public K-12
21	school, may seek care for the student's seizures while the

25	developed by the student's parent or guardian and the

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(1) Before or at the beginning of the school year.

4 (2) Upon enrollment of the student, if the student
5 enrolls in a school after the beginning of the school year.

6 (3) As soon as practicable following a diagnosis of 7 a seizure disorder for the student.

8 (b) A seizure management and treatment plan shall9 include all of the following:

10 (1) A list of the health care services the student 11 may receive at school or while participating in a 12 school-sponsored activity.

13 (2) An evaluation of the student's level of
14 understanding and ability to manage his or her seizures.

15 (3) The signature of the student's parent or16 guardian.

17 (4) The signature of the physician responsible for18 the student's seizure treatment.

(c) A school employee shall be immune from suit and not liable for any civil damages as a result of his or her acts or omissions in the supervision or rendering of services, care, or assistance to a student under this chapter, nor shall he or she be liable for any civil damages as a result of any act, or failure to act, to provide or arrange for further treatment, care, or assistance.

26 (d) A physician has no supervisory authority over
 27 the school's execution of the seizure management and treatment

plan, and therefore shall be immune from civil liability for any orders, acts or omissions directly related to this chapter, including any vicarious liability for the acts and omissions of school employees and officials in carrying out the seizure management and treatment plan.

7 (a) A school nurse employed by a local board of
8 education shall complete a State Board of Education-approved
9 online course of instruction for school nurses regarding
10 managing students with seizure disorders that includes
11 information about seizure recognition and related first aid.

(b) A school employee, other than a school nurse, whose duties at the school include regular contact with students shall complete a State Board of Education-approved online course of instruction for school personnel regarding awareness of students with seizure disorders that includes information about seizure recognition and related first aid.

18 (c) The State Board of Education may approve an online course of instruction provided by a nonprofit national 19 20 foundation that supports the welfare of individuals with 21 epilepsy and seizure disorders to satisfy the training 22 required under subsection (a) or subsection (b). An online 23 course of instruction approved by the State Board of Education 24 under this subsection that is provided to a local board of 25 education must be provided by the nonprofit entity free of charge. 26

(d) The State Department of Education shall adopt
 rules as necessary to administer this section.

3 Section 3. Not later than December 1, 2020, the 4 State Board of Education shall approve online courses of 5 instruction to satisfy the training requirements of Chapter 6 30C, Title 16, Code of Alabama 1975, as added by this act.

Section 4. This act shall apply beginning with the
2020-2021 school year.

9 Section 5. This act shall become effective on the 10 first day of the third month following its passage and 11 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
