27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. For purposes of determining eligibility 1 2 for benefits and protections pursuant to Title 25 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to employment and unemployment, or 3 for determining tax liability for employees and employers 4 pursuant to Title 40 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to 5 revenue and taxation, an employer or state agency responsible 6 7 for determining the employment status of an individual shall use the test enumerated by the Internal Revenue Service in 8 Rev. Rul. 87-41, 1987-1 C.B. 296, as amended or replaced from 9 10 time to time, in making its determination.

11 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 12 first day of the third month following its passage and 13 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
