(b) A judge carrying a pistol pursuant to this section shall be immune from civil or criminal liability for any act involving the use of that pistol, absent wanton, willful, or intentional conduct. This subsection does not in any way prohibit a claim of self-defense under existing law.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
