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22	To amend Section 16-23-3, Code of Alabama 1975,
23	relating to provisional teaching certificates; to authorize
24	the State Board of Education to establish and issue an
25	alternative teaching certificate to certain qualified former
26	members of the United States Armed Forces.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. Section 16-23-3 of the Code of Alabama
 1975, is amended to read as follows:

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"§16-23-3.

"(a) It is the intent of the Legislature that the 4 5 State of Alabama shall modify its policies relative to the certification of teachers to permit an expanded alternative 6 7 certification program for prospective teachers for grades six through 12. In addition to certificates issued pursuant to 8 this chapter to individuals graduating from approved teacher 9 10 education programs, the State Board of Education shall adopt policies, procedures, rules, regulations, or standards 11 authorizing an alternative certificate to be issued by the 12 13 State Superintendent of Education to an individual, regardless 14 of whether the individual is a graduate of an approved teacher 15 education program, where the applicant shall:

16 "(1) Hold an earned bachelor's or higher degree from17 a regionally accredited institution of higher education.

"(2) Submit the required application forms and fees
and, when required, a separate fingerprint fee, along with
fingerprints and release forms.

"(3) Be recommended for certification by the employing Alabama local school superintendent or private school administrator.

24 "(4) Be assigned a mentor by the employing25 superintendent or private school administrator.

"(5) Meet the requirements of the Alabama 1 2 Prospective Teacher Testing Program as set forth by the State Board of Education. 3 "(6) Verify compliance with one of the following 4 admission criteria: 5 "a. That at least 32 semester hours credit, 19 of 6 7 which shall be upper division level, have been earned in the field for which certification is sought. 8 9 "b. An earned bachelor's or higher degree from a 10 regionally accredited institution of higher education with a non-education major in the academic area for which 11 certification is sought. 12 13 "c. A passing score on the appropriate Praxis II 14 content test of the Alabama Prospective Teacher Testing 15 Program. "(7) Request that an official transcript be sent 16 17 directly to the employing superintendent or private school 18 administrator. "(b) The State Board of Education shall further 19 20 adopt policies, procedures, rules, regulations, or standards 21 authorizing an alternative certificate to be issued by the 22 State Superintendent of Education to an individual, regardless 23 of whether the individual is a graduate of an approved teacher 24 education program, where the applicant shall: 25 "(1) Hold a master's or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education. 26

1"(2) Be a retiree in good standing, or honorably2discharged former member of the Armed Forces of the United3States, with at least 10 years of service.

"(3) Otherwise satisfy all other requirements of
subsection (a), as they relate to a master's or higher degree,
except for the requirement that he or she verify a passing
score on the appropriate Praxis II content test of the Alabama
Prospective Teacher Testing Program as provided in paragraph
c. of subdivision (6) of subsection (a).

10 "(b)(c) Any alternative certificate shall be valid 11 for the period of time as shall be set by policies, 12 procedures, rules, regulations, or standards which shall be 13 adopted by the State Board of Education but in no event shall 14 such period extend beyond four years from the July 1 beginning 15 date of the initial alternative certificate.

16 "(c)(d) Where an individual has received an 17 alternative certificate or certificates and has been employed 18 for three full years by no more than two county or city school 19 boards or private schools while holding alternative 20 certificates, the individual may be granted a teaching 21 certificate issued by the State Superintendent of Education 22 pursuant to Section 16-23-1, when:

23 "(1) Approved by the State Superintendent of24 Education.

"(2) Approved according to policies, procedures,
rules, regulations, or standards which shall be adopted by the
State Board of Education. Such policies, procedures, rules,

regulations, or standards shall require that the recipient of an alternative certificate successfully complete no more than the equivalent of 12 semester hours of college course work in education related courses, as may be determined by the State Board of Education based upon factors such as the recipient's individual educational background, prior to the issuance of a teaching certificate pursuant to Section 16-23-1.

"(d) (e) Any individual granted a teaching 8 9 certificate issued by the State Superintendent of Education 10 pursuant to Section 16-23-1, following the receipt of an alternative certificate, as herein provided, may be eligible 11 12 to attain continuing service status pursuant to Chapter 24 of 13 this title 24C, the Students First Act of 2011. Time served as a teacher pursuant to an alternative certificate shall be 14 15 counted in determining continuing service status pursuant to 16 Section 16-24-2 16-24C-4.

17 "(e)(f) The State Superintendent of Education in 18 cases of emergency when certified teachers, including teachers who may have received alternative certificates pursuant to 19 20 this section, are not available may grant emergency 21 certificates of the different kinds and grades, but any such emergency certificate shall not be valid for a period to 22 23 exceed two years but shall expire at the end of the scholastic 24 year for which it is issued. An emergency certificate may be 25 extended or renewed one time as provided by policies, 26 procedures, rules, regulations, or standards adopted by the State Board of Education, for a maximum validity of four 27

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years. Time served as a teacher pursuant to an emergency
 certificate shall not be counted in determining continuing
 service status pursuant to Section 16-24-2 16-24C-4.

4 "(f)(g) Any alternative certificate issued pursuant 5 to this section shall be limited to individuals teaching 6 grades six through 12; provided, however, that an alternative 7 certificate may be issued for individuals teaching grades 8 kindergarten through eight if limited to the subject areas of 9 the fine arts or foreign languages, or both."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
