3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 11-52-2, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$11-52-2.

- "(a) Any municipality is hereby authorized and empowered to make, adopt, amend, extend, add to, or carry out a municipal plan as provided in this article and to create by ordinance a planning commission with the powers and duties herein set forth.
- "(b) The planning commission of a city shall be designated city planning commission and the planning commission of a town, town planning commission, as its council may specify.
- "(c) If the Department of Examiners of Public

  Accounts determines and certifies to the Alabama Department of

  Economic and Community Affairs that any Class 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5

  municipality has not created and adopted a municipal plan as

  authorized by this article, or has neglected or otherwise

  failed to execute its adopted municipal plan in good faith,

  that municipality shall not be eligible to receive any grants

  from the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs

  until the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts certifies

  to the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs

  that the municipality is in good faith executing a municipal

  plan created and adopted under this article."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
