1	Relating to the Alabama Board of Athletic Trainers;
2	to amend Sections 34-40-2, 34-40-3, 34-40-5, 34-40-6, 34-40-9,
3	34-40-10, 34-40-15, and 34-40-16, Code of Alabama 1975, to

5	trainers; and to add Section 34-40-3.2 to the Code of Alabama

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
10	Section 1. Sections 34-40-2, 34-40-3, 34-40-5,
11	34-40-6, 34-40-9, 34-40-10, 34-40-15, and 34-40-16 of the Code
12	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

14	"As used in this chapter, the following words and
15	phrases terms shall have the following meanings, respectively,
16	unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	"(1) APPRENTICE ATHLETIC TRAINER. A person who
18	assists in the duties usually performed by an athletic trainer
19	and who works under the direct supervision of a licensed
20	athletic trainer.
21	" (2) ATHLETE. A person who participates in an
22	athletic activity being conducted by an educational
23	institution, professional athletic organization, or a board
24	sanctioned amateur athletic organization.
25	"(1) ADVISORY COUNCIL. The Advisory Council of the
26	State Board of Medical Examiners and the Alabama Board of
27	Athletic Trainers created pursuant to Section 34-40-3.2.

1 "(3)(2) ATHLETIC INJURY. An injury or condition 2 sustained received by an athlete as a result of, or limiting the preparation for or participation of the athlete in, an 3 athletic activity exercise, sport, game, recreational 4 5 activity, or any other activity that requires a level of strength, endurance, flexibility, or agility that is 6 7 comparable to the level of strength, endurance, flexibility, 8 or agility required for an exercise, sport, game, or 9 recreational activity; or any injury that a physician deems 10 would benefit from athletic training services. "(4)(3) ATHLETIC TRAINER. A person An individual 11 licensed by the Alabama Board of Athletic Trainers as an 12 13 athletic trainer and who practices athletic training on an athlete under the direction or referral, or both, of a 14 15 licensed physician after meeting the requirements of this 16 chapter and rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this 17 chapter. 18 "(5)(4) ATHLETIC TRAINING PRACTICE. Practice by an athletic trainer <u>under</u> physician supervision of any of the 19 20 following: 21 "a. Under physician direction or referral, or both, 22 the prevention of athletic injuries The application of care for an athletic injury, including the application or provision 23 24 of any of the following: 25 "1. Principles, methods, and procedures of recognition, examination, assessment, clinical evaluation, 26

1	prevention, management, emergency care, disposition, or
2	rehabilitation and reconditioning of athletic injuries.
3	"2. Appropriate preventive and supportive devices.
4	"3. Treatment using physical modalities such as
5	heat, cold, light, mechanical devices, electric stimulation,
6	manual therapy techniques, aquatic therapy, sound, or
7	therapeutic exercise.
8	"4. Any other physical agent that is included within
9	the written protocols allowed by the State Board of Medical
10	Examiners and prescribed by a physician.
11	"b. The organization and administration of athletic
12	training programs, including health care administration and
13	professional responsibility.
14	"c. Athletic counseling The provision of athletic
15	training, education, and guidance and the education of
16	athletes regarding athletics and athletic training to
17	physically active individuals, coaches, medical personnel, and
18	the community in the prevention and care of athletic injuries.
19	"d. Under physician direction and referral, the
20	rehabilitation and reconditioning of an athlete The
21	recognition of potential illnesses and referrals to a

23	"e. Under physician supervision, the evaluation, the

- 1 "(6) (5) BOARD. The Alabama Board of Athletic 2 Trainers. "(6) INJURY PREVENTION. Care and guidance related to 3 risk management, including biomechanics, conditioning, 4 5 flexibility, nutrition, strength training, and fitness. "(7) PHYSICAL THERAPIST. A physical therapist 6 7 licensed by the Alabama State Board of Physical Therapy. "(8) PHYSICIAN. A physician licensed by the Medical 8 Licensure Commission of Alabama. 9 10 "(9) PHYSICIAN SUPERVISION. a. An A licensed athletic trainer acting under the supervision of a physician 11 if: 12 13 "a.1. The activities are undertaken pursuant to a verbal or written order of the physician who has evaluated the 14 15 injured athlete physically active individual; and or 16 "b.2. The activity is undertaken in accordance with 17 a written protocol signed by the physician which that 18 describes the athletic injury encountered and directs appropriate medical interventions consistent with the 19 20 qualification, training, and experience of the licensed 21 athletic trainer. The State Board of Medical Examiners shall 22 establish minimum medical criteria for any protocol used by 23 athletic trainers and shall specify those conditions and 24 circumstances which that require referral to the physician for 25 further evaluation. 26 "b. Physician supervision establishes a formal
- 27 relationship between an athletic trainer and a physician under

which the athletic trainer is authorized to practice as 1 2 evidenced by a written protocol approved by the State Board of Medical Examiners and requires professional oversight and 3 direction pursuant to the rules of the State Board of Medical 4 5 Examiners and the Alabama Board of Athletic Trainers as recommended by the advisory council. No rule adopted pursuant 6 7 to this paragraph shall be effective without the approval of 8 both the State Board of Medical Examiners and the board. "\$34-40-3. 9

"(a) The Alabama Board of Athletic Trainers shall be
composed of nine members who shall serve four-year terms.
Members may not serve more than three consecutive four-year
terms. Three members shall be Black <u>a member of a minority</u>
<u>class</u>, one of whom shall be a physician member. The
composition of the board shall be as follows:

"(1) Six members <u>who are athletic trainers</u>,
appointed by the Alabama Athletic Trainers <u>Trainers'</u>
Association in accordance with subsection (b), one of whom
shall <u>also</u> be an athletic trainer who is a licensed <u>a</u> physical
therapist.

"(2) Three physicians licensed to practice medicine
actively engaged in the treatment of athletes and athletic
injuries or illnesses, appointed by the Medical Association of
the State of Alabama.

"(3) The President of the Alabama Athletic Trainers
 <u>Trainers'</u> Association who shall serve as an ex officio member
 of the board and whose term of office shall be yearly to

coincide with his or her term as President of the Alabama
 Athletic Trainers Trainers' Association.

3 "(b) The six athletic trainers shall be appointed by the The Alabama Athletic Trainers Trainers' Association. The 4 association shall conduct an annual meeting at which all 5 athletic trainers holding a current license as identified 6 7 under this chapter shall have the right to attend, nominate, and vote for the athletic trainer members of the board. The 8 9 association shall regulate and prescribe the date, hour, and 10 place of the meeting, the method of nomination, and the manner of voting. At least 30 days prior to the meeting, the board 11 shall mail send notices to each current licensee at the 12 13 address shown on the current registration notifying of the 14 exact date, hour, and place of the meeting, the purpose of the meeting, and of the right to attend and vote. To qualify as a 15 board member pursuant to this subsection, a person shall be a 16 citizen of the United States and a resident of this state and 17 18 have acted as an athletic trainer for three years within this 19 state immediately preceding appointment.

20 "(c) In making the initial appointments, the Alabama 21 Athletic Trainers' Association shall appoint one athletic trainer whose term will expire in 1994, two athletic 22 trainers whose terms will expire in 1995, and one athletic 23 24 trainer whose term will expire in 1996, and two athletic 25 trainers whose terms will expire in 1997. The Medical Association of the State of Alabama shall appoint one 26 physician whose term will expire in 1994, one physician whose 27

term will expire in 1995, and one physician whose term will expire in 1996. All appointments expire on December 31 of the year specified.

4 "(d) Each appointee to the board shall qualify by
5 taking an oath of office within 15 days from the date of the
6 appointment. In the event of death, resignation, or removal of
7 any member, except for physician members, the vacancy of the
8 unexpired term shall be filled by the board.

9 "(e) The board shall elect a chair, a vice-chair, 10 and secretary from its members for a term of one year and may appoint any committees and formulate any rules it considers 11 necessary to carry out its duties pursuant to this chapter. 12 13 The board shall meet at least twice each year. Additional meetings may be held on the call of the chair or at the 14 15 written request of any two members of the board. The secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the board. The board 16 17 may promulgate and adopt rules and regulations consistent with 18 this chapter which are necessary for the performance of its duties. The board may employ an executive secretary and any 19 officers and employees as may be necessary to carry out the 20 21 duties of the board. The State Board of Medical Examiners and 22 the Alabama Board of Athletic Trainers shall jointly approve 23 any rule, regulation, or policy that interprets, explains, or 24 enumerates the permissible acts, functions, or services 25 rendered by an athletic trainer or apprentice athletic trainer as those acts, functions, and services are defined in Section 26 34-40-2. Any rule, regulation, or policy adopted in violation 27

of this requirement is invalid. The board shall prescribe
<u>methods and</u> forms for license applications, license
certificate, license renewal, verification of license,
continuing education verification, and any forms for
information required from licensees to carry out the duties of
the board. The board shall adopt an official seal and a
license certificate of suitable design.

8 "(f) Members of the board shall receive fifty 9 dollars (\$50) one hundred dollars (\$100) for every day 10 actually spent in the performance of their duties and in 11 addition thereto shall be reimbursed according to the state 12 travel policy for other expenses in the same amounts and under 13 the same conditions as state employees are reimbursed.

14 "(g) It shall be the duty of the The board to shall 15 pass upon the qualifications of applicants for licensure as an athletic trainer, and to issue licenses and annual renewals to 16 17 athletic trainers. The board shall be responsible for fixing 18 fix fees for such applications, licenses, renewals, verification of licensure, replacement of licenses, name 19 20 changes on of licensees, publication fees, or other 21 administration fees deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter. 22

"(a) Any person seeking licensure as an athletic
trainer shall be a citizen of the United States or, if not a
citizen of the United States, a person who is legally present
in the United States with appropriate documentation from the

1 federal government, and meet at least one of the following 2 requirements:

"(1) Satisfactory completion of all of the National
Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) Board of Certification,
Inc., or its successor organization, qualifications and;
certification as an athletic trainer in good standing by the
National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of
Certification, Inc.; and eligibility for a National Provider
Identifier.

10 "(2) Licensure by reciprocity. The board shall 11 grant, without examination, licensure to any qualified 12 <u>athletic</u> trainer holding a license certificate or registration 13 in another state if that state maintains licensure 14 qualifications which that are substantially equivalent to 15 those required in this state, and gives similar reciprocity to 16 licensees of this state.

17 "(b) Any person desiring to be licensed, desiring a 18 renewal of an existing license, desiring verification of licensure, reinstatement of a license, replacement of a 19 20 license, or name changes for a licensee as an athletic trainer 21 in this state shall make and file with the board, not less 22 than 30 days prior to any regular meeting thereof, a written 23 application on a form or request as prescribed by the board. 24 The application shall be accompanied by the payment of a fee, 25 as set by the board, to include publication fees or other 26 administrative fees deemed necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter, in accordance with subsection (g) 27

- of Section 34-40-3. Any licensee who fails to renew his or her license within 90 days following expiration of the previous license shall be required to file a new application and pay an application fee with the board.
- 5 "§34-40-6.

"An athletic trainer, <u>as a qualified health care</u>
<u>professional</u>, functioning under the supervision of a
physician, may use therapeutic exercise and modalities for the
treatment of athletic injuries for which he or she has
received appropriate training or education.

12 "(a) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as 13 preventing or restricting any of the following persons from 14 engaging in the profession or occupation for which they are 15 licensed, certified, or registered in Alabama as follows:

"§34-40-9.

16 "(1) Physicians and surgeons licensed by the Medical17 Licensure Commission of Alabama.

18 "(2) Dentists licensed by the State Board of Dental19 Examiners.

20 "(3) Optometrists licensed by the State Board of21 Optometry.

"(4) Nurses licensed by the Alabama Board ofNursing.

24 "(5) Chiropractors licensed by the State Board of25 Chiropractic Examiners.

26 "(6) Podiatrists licensed by the State Board of 27 Podiatry.

- "(7) Physical therapists licensed by the State Board
 of Physical Therapy.
- 3 "(8) Occupational therapists licensed by the State4 Board of Occupational Therapy.
- 5 "(9) Emergency medical technicians licensed by the 6 State Department of Public Health.
- 7 "(10) Physician assistants licensed by the State
 8 Board of Medical Examiners.
- 9 "(11) Massage therapists licensed by the Alabama
 10 Board of Massage Therapy.
- 11 "(b) This chapter shall not apply to the following 12 persons:
- "(1) Coaches and physical education instructors inthe performance of their duties.
- 15 "(2) Apprentice athletic trainers who confine
 16 themselves to the duties prescribed in this chapter.
- 17 "(3)(2) Athletic trainers from other nations, 18 states, or territories performing their duties for their 19 respective teams or organizations and only during the course 20 of their team's or organization's stay in this state.
- 21 "(4)(3) A person who performs any of the services
 22 set forth in this chapter as long as the person does not
 23 violate this chapter.
- 24 "\$34-40-10.
- 25 "The board may refuse to issue a license certificate 26 to any person and, after notice and hearing pursuant to its 27 regulations and rules, may suspend or revoke the license

certificate of any person who has done does any of the following:

"(1) Practiced Practices athletic training other
than under the direction or referral, or both, supervision of
a physician licensed to practice medicine or surgery.

6 "(2) Uses drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent 7 which affects professional competency.

8 "(3) Obtained or attempted Obtains or attempts to 9 obtain a license by fraud or deception.

10 "(4) Been <u>Is found to be</u> grossly negligent in the 11 practice of athletic training.

"(5) Been Is adjudged mentally incompetent by a
 court of competent jurisdiction.

14 "(6) Been <u>Is found to be</u> guilty of conduct
15 detrimental to the best interest of the public.

"(7) Has <u>Is or has</u> been imprisoned for violating any
 state or federal controlled substance law.

18 "(8) Treated <u>Is treating</u> or <u>has</u> undertaken to treat 19 human ailments otherwise than by athletic training and 20 according to standards established by the board.

21 "(9) Advertised Advertises unethically according to
22 standards as set by the board.

23 "(10) Failed or refused Fails or refuses to obey any
24 lawful order or regulation <u>rule</u> of the board.

25 "(11) Unlawful Engages in the unlawful invasion of
 26 the field of practice of any other profession.

27 "\$34-40-15.

"Nothing in this chapter shall authorize an athletic trainer or apprentice athletic trainer to engage in the practice of medicine; to diagnose, treat, or cure any human disease, illness, ailment, infirmity, pain, or other condition which that is not an athletic injury; to perform surgery of any type or description; or to prescribe any drug or medical device.

"§34-40-16.

9 "An athletic trainer employed in a physical therapy 10 clinic shall work under the <u>administrative</u> supervision of a 11 licensed physical therapist in the context of an 12 employer/employee relationship. The <u>authority of the physical</u> 13 <u>therapist may not supersede the authority of the physician</u> 14 <u>regarding treatment</u>, in accordance with physician supervision 15 of the athletic trainer."

Section 2. Section 34-10-3.2 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§34-10-3.2.

(a) There is created the Advisory Council of the
State Board of Medical Examiners and the Alabama Board of
Athletic Trainers. The membership of the advisory council
shall include all of the following:

(1) Three physicians, appointed by the State Board
of Medical Examiners.

(2) Three athletic trainers appointed by the board.
(b) In order to stagger the terms of office, the
three physician members of the advisory council shall serve

initial terms of one, two, and three years, as determined by 1 2 the State Board of Medical Examiners, and terms of three years thereafter, and the three athletic trainer members of the 3 advisory council shall serve initial terms of one, two, and 4 5 three years, as determined by the board, and terms of three years thereafter. Should a vacancy occur on the advisory 6 7 council, a successor shall be appointed by the original 8 appointing authority to serve the remainder of the unexpired 9 term.

10 (c) The advisory council shall meet annually, or 11 more frequently if agreed by both the State Board of Medical 12 Examiners and the board. During the annual meeting, the 13 membership of the advisory council shall select one of its 14 members to serve as chair for a term of one year. The office 15 of chair shall alternate between a physician member and an 16 athletic trainer member.

17 (d) Members of the advisory council shall receive 18 per diem at a rate of one hundred dollars (\$100) per day or any portion thereof that the advisory council member is 19 20 attending an official meeting or function of the advisory 21 council. In addition, each member of the advisory council 22 shall receive reimbursement for subsistence and travel in 23 accordance with state law as provided for state employees, for 24 each day actively engaged in the duties of the office. 25 Compensation of the members of the advisory council shall be 26 paid by the appointing authority, and the appointing authorities shall furnish necessary clerical and 27

1 administrative support for the operation of the advisory 2 council.

(e) Any provision of this chapter to the contrary 3 notwithstanding, the advisory council shall recommend model 4 5 practice protocols to be used by athletic trainers, subject to approval by both the State Board of Medical Examiners and the 6 7 board. The advisory council shall be limited to voting on new standard protocols, adding or deleting existing protocols, and 8 amending existing protocols. The advisory council may 9 10 recommend rules establishing the ratio of physicians to athletic trainers and the manner in which a supervising 11 physician may designate an alternate supervising physician 12 13 when temporarily unavailable as the supervising physician. The 14 advisory council may not grant deviations from protocol. No 15 rule or protocol shall be effective until approved by both the 16 State Board of Medical Examiners and the board.

17 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 18 first day of the third month following its passage and 19 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
