20	Relating to pistol permits; to amend Section
21	13A-11-75.1, of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by Act
22	2019-525 of the 2019 Regular Session, providing for the
23	issuance of a pistol permit to a retired military veteran
24	without the payment of a fee, to further authorize an active
25	member of the U.S. Armed Forces and a honorably discharged
26	veteran to be issued a pistol permit without the payment of a
27	fee.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
2	Section 1. Section 13A-11-75.1, Code of Alabama
3	1975, as amended by Act 2019-525 of the 2019 Regular Session,
4	is further amended to read as follows:
5	"§13A-11-75.1.
6	"(a) The words retired military veteran as used in
7	this section, unless the context clearly requires a different
8	meaning, means only those persons who are retirees from active
9	duty in the Army, or the Navy, or the Marine Corps, or the Air
10	Force, or the Coast Guard of the United States or any reserve
11	or National Guard component thereof. For the purposes of this
12	section, the following words have the following meanings:
13	"(1) HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERAN. A person who has
14	been honorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces as
15	evidenced by the veteran's DD-214 form, or if the veteran does
16	not have a DD-214 form, as evidenced by the Veteran's Record
17	and Report of Separation Honorable Discharge Record.
18	"(2) MEMBER OF THE U.S. ARMED FORCES. An active
19	member of the U.S. Armed Forces as evidenced by a current
20	valid U.S. Military Identification.
21	"(3) RETIRED MILITARY VETERAN. A person who is
22	retired from active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces as evidenced
23	by a U.S. government issued Veteran Identification Card or
24	Veteran's DD-214 form.
25	"(4) U.S. ARMED FORCES. The Army, Navy, Marine
26	Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard of the United States, or any
27	reserve or National Guard component thereof.

"(b) (1) Any member of the U.S. Armed Forces, an honorable discharged veteran, or any retired military veteran who meets the conditions for issuance of a pistol permit pursuant to Section 13A-11-75 shall be eligible to obtain the pistol permit without paying a fee for the permit. Upon approval of the pistol permit application, the pistol permit shall be issued by the sheriff of the county in which the veteran resides upon presentation by the.

"(2) In order to obtain a pistol permit under this section, a retired military veteran of the United States Armed Forces government issued Veteran Identification Card or a DD-214 Proof of Military Service form and shall present sufficient proof that the person is a military retiree, an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces shall present proof of his or her current status as an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces, and an honorably discharged veteran shall present proof that he or she has been honorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces.

"(3) The retired military veteran shall holder of the pistol permit issued under this section may apply for renewal as required by law, but shall be eligible to obtain renewed pistol permits without paying a fee as long as he or she meets the conditions for renewal of the permit.

"(c) In the event <u>an active member of the U.S. Armed</u>

Forces, a person who has been honorably discharged from the

U.S. Armed Forces, or a retired veteran, to whom a pistol

permit has been issued pursuant to subsection (b), is

suspected of or is charged with or convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude, as defined in Section 17-3-30.1, domestic violence in the first degree, as defined in Section 13A-6-130, or domestic violence in the second degree, as defined in Section 13A-6-131, then the sheriff of the county in which the retired veteran holder of the pistol permit resides may revoke the pistol permit. The sheriff shall notify the retired veteran holder of the pistol permit in writing and by registered mail that his or her pistol permit is revoked. The sheriff shall state the reasons for the revocation and order the retiree holder of the pistol permit to return his or her pistol permit to that sheriff within 30 days. Should the retired veteran holder of the pistol permit refuse to return the pistol permit within the 30-day limit and continue to carry the handgun, he or she shall be quilty of carrying a weapon without a license or carrying a concealed weapon, whichever might be the case." Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
