18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
19	Section 1. (a) Respecting the authority of teachers
20	is essential to creating an environment conducive to learning,
21	effective instruction in the classroom, and proper
22	administration of local public K-12 schools. To maintain and
23	protect that authority, it is important that teachers,
24	administrators, parents, and students are fully informed of
25	the various rights conferred upon teachers. Together with, and
26	in addition to, those rights otherwise provided in Title 16 of

1 the Code of Alabama 1975, the rights include, but are not 2 limited to, all of the following:

3 (1) A teacher has the right to teach free from the
4 fear of frivolous lawsuits, including the right to qualified
5 immunity and to a legal defense, and to indemnification by his
6 or her employing board of education, for actions taken in the
7 performance of duties of his or her employment.

8 (2) A teacher has the right to use appropriate means 9 of discipline up to and including corporal punishment as may 10 be prescribed by the local board of education, and, so long as 11 the teacher follows approved policy in the exercise of his or 12 her responsibility to maintain discipline in the classroom, 13 the teacher shall be immune from civil or criminal liability.

14 (3) A teacher has the right to remove any 15 persistently disruptive student from his or her classroom when 16 the behavior of the student prevents the orderly instruction 17 of other students, or when the student displays impudent or 18 defiant behavior, and to place the student in the custody of 19 the principal or his or her designee.

(4) A teacher has the right to have his or her
professional judgment and discretion respected by school and
district administrators in any disciplinary action taken by
the teacher in accordance with school and district policy.

(5) A teacher has the right to teach in a safe,
secure, and orderly environment that is conducive to learning
and free from recognized dangers or hazards that are causing
or likely to cause serious injury.

(6) A teacher has the right to be treated with
 civility and respect.

3 (7) A teacher has the right to communicate with and
4 to request the participation of parents in appropriate student
5 disciplinary decisions.

6 (8) A teacher has the right to complete only 7 paperwork that is not excessively burdensome and that, if 8 required by law, regulation, or policy, adheres to the law, 9 regulation, or policy and does not result in overly cumbersome 10 interpretations of that law, regulation, or policy.

(9) A beginning teacher has the right to receive leadership and support, including the assignment of a qualified, experienced mentor who commits to helping him or her become a competent, confident professional in the classroom and offers support and assistance as needed to meet performance standards and professional expectations.

17 (10) A teacher has the right to be afforded time
18 during the school day or week to collaborate with other
19 teachers.

(b) No local board of education shall establish
policies that prevent teachers from exercising the rights
provided in this section or in Title 16, Code of Alabama 1975.

(c) This section may not be construed to supersede
 any other state law, State Board of Education regulation or
 policy, or local board of education policy adopted relating to
 the discipline of students.

(d) Each local board of education shall provide a 1 2 copy of this section to all teachers at the beginning of each school year. Each local board of education shall also post a 3 copy of the rights provided in this section in a prominent 4 5 place in every school and administrative building operated by the local board of education and provide a copy to parents or 6 7 legal guardians of all children attending those schools in a form and manner approved by the local board of education. Each 8 local board of education and every school under its 9 10 jurisdiction that maintains an Internet website shall post a 11 copy of this section on that website.

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
