  2 telephone number of the department's toll-free hotline for

  - (3) The Internet website address maintained by the department for the purpose of allowing persons to report suspected fraud in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.
  - (b) Except as provided for minors under subsection (c), the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, upon request by the department, shall provide the department with the photographs of a recipient and each person authorized on the recipient's account that the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency has in its records. The department shall use the photographs to comply with subsection (a). The department may enter into memoranda of understanding with the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency for purposes of this section.
  - (c) If a recipient of benefits is a minor, the department shall use the photograph of the minor's parent or legal guardian to satisfy the requirements of subsection (a).
  - (d) The requirements of this section do not apply to an individual who is any of the following:
    - (1) Sixty-five years of age or older.
    - (2) Blind or mentally or physically disabled.
    - (3) A victim of domestic violence.

(e) The department may adopt rules for the implementation and administration of this act.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
