a college located in Alabama and who commit to teach in rural 1 2 areas of the state with the greatest need for grades 7-12 STEM and special education teachers; to provide that service 3 contracts be entered into between the student and the Alabama 4 5 Commission on Higher Education and between the Alabama Commission on Higher Education and each of the institutions of 6 7 higher education in the state offering a teacher preparation program; and to provide for funding through the Alabama 8 9 Commission on Higher Education. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. For the purposes of this act, the 12 following terms shall have the following meanings:

(1) ACHE. Alabama Commission on Higher Education.
(2) COLLEGE. A four year institution of higher
education located in the state that offers a teacher
preparation program.

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(3) INITIATIVE. The Alabama Teacher Initiative.

(4) SERVICE CONTRACT. A document signed by and
agreed to by the student and the Alabama Commission on Higher
Education setting forth terms for receiving tuition
scholarship funds and service requirements.

(5) STUDENT. An individual enrolled in and attendinga teacher preparation program in a college.

(6) TEACHER. An individual who is certificated by
the State Department of Education to teach science,
technology, engineering, or mathematics or a special education

curriculum in the schools offering instruction in grades 7-12
 of this state.

3 Section 2. (a) ACHE shall administer a student
4 scholarship program to increase the availability of teachers
5 by providing incentives to students who agree to teach in a
6 rural area of Alabama for five years immediately after
7 certification.

8 (b) A scholarship awarded under this act shall be 9 used to provide tuition funding support to a student enrolled 10 at a college and may not be used to reduce any other financial 11 aid, grant, or scholarship the student may otherwise receive.

Section 3. (a) Before the 2021 fall semester, and 12 13 before each fall semester thereafter, ACHE and the chief academic officer of each participating college shall jointly 14 15 select up to 50 incoming first year students to participate in the initiative. The maximum number of students participating 16 17 in the initiative at any one time may not exceed 200. Each 18 student selected shall be enrolled full time at a college in a teacher preparation program that is designed to prepare the 19 20 student to become certified in a STEM-related field or special 21 education. If a student, upon initial selection, declines to participate in the initiative, ACHE may select a qualified 22 23 alternate.

(b) After selection, to be eligible to receive
scholarship funds, the student shall execute a service
contract with ACHE committing to complete his or her college
degree and certification in a STEM-related field or special

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education curriculum and to teach for five years in Alabama, under the terms of the service contract, in a rural area of the state defined by current state and national data. A student selected to participate in the initiative shall complete all educational requirements of the college in four years and may not qualify for a scholarship for more than four school years.

8 Section 4. (a) ACHE shall contract with the college 9 to provide scholarship funds for students participating in the 10 initiative. The amount of the scholarship funds awarded each 11 school year shall be determined by ACHE based on the annual 12 tuition charged by the college and appropriated by the 13 Legislature.

14 (b) ACHE shall provide the necessary management,15 staff, and accountability in implementing the initiative.

16 Section 5. Upon completion of his or her degree and 17 certification, and pursuant to the terms of the service 18 contract, the former student shall teach in a rural area of 19 the state for five years.

20 Section 6. A student or former student who fails to 21 comply with the terms and conditions of the service contract 22 shall return all scholarship funds received pursuant to the 23 service contract, plus interest computed as specified in the 24 binding student service contract, to ACHE.

25 Section 7. The student scholarship program 26 administered by ACHE shall be funded by legislative 27 appropriation through ACHE. To receive funding for scholarships awarded pursuant to this act, ACHE shall make an
 annual report and funding request to the Legislature.

3 Section 8. ACHE shall adopt rules as necessary to
4 implement this act.

5 Section 9. This act shall become effective on the 6 first day of the third month following its passage and 7 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
