27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this act, the 2 term "school" includes both public and private K-12 schools, but does not include private residences used for the purpose of home schooling. 4

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- (b) (1) A school that has one or more employees may barricade or block a door for a period not to exceed three minutes in the event of an unplanned fire alarm activation in order for a designated school official to investigate the alarm. Unless otherwise provided in subdivision (2), the school must initiate evacuation and safety procedures after the three-minute period expires.
- (2) If an active shooter has been verified to be present on school property, the school may extend the initial three-minute period required by this subsection.
- (c) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the implementation and enforcement of this section.
- (d) Each local board of education shall amend its comprehensive school emergency operations plan or shall otherwise adopt and implement procedures to reflect the requirements of this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
