The 3 disclosure statement shall not be required for contracts for 4 5 gas, water, and electric services where no competition exists, or where rates are fixed by law or ordinance. In circumstances 6 7 where a contract is awarded by competitive bid, the disclosure 8 statement shall be required only from the person receiving the 9 contract and shall be submitted by that person within 10 days 10 of the award.

"(c) Any provision of this article to the contrary 11 12 notwithstanding, a person entering into multiple grants or 13 contracts with the same state agency, department, or division 14 during the same year may submit a single comprehensive annual disclosure statement to that agency, department, or division. 15 16 The person entering into the grants or contracts with the 17 state shall have 30 days after any information contained in 18 the original annual disclosure statement becomes inaccurate or 19 incomplete to submit an amended annual disclosure statement. 20 "§41-16-83.

"(a) The information required on the disclosure statement shall be made under oath and penalty as prescribed herein and shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

"(1) A list of the names and addresses of any public
official, and public employee, and or family members member of
the public official and or public employee, who may have a

family relationship with the <u>submitting</u> person or his or her immediate family members, or his or her employees, <u>and</u> who may directly personally benefit financially from the contract, proposal, request for proposal, invitation to bid, or grant proposal.

"(2) A description of any financial benefit that may
be knowingly gained by any public official, public employee,
and or family members member of the public official and or
public employee that may result either directly or indirectly
from the person or his or her immediate family members, or his
or her employees.

"(3) The names and addresses of any paid consultant or lobbyist for the contract, proposal, request for proposal, invitation to bid, or grant proposal.

"(b) The Except as provided in Section 41-16-89, the
State of Alabama shall not enter into any contract or
appropriate any public funds with any person who refuses to
provide information required by this section.

"(c) An unsworn certification meeting the
 requirements of this section shall have the same effect as a
 sworn statement if the certification is signed and all of the
 following are included:
