Relating to the Department of Corrections; to amend Section 14-1-1.5, Code of Alabama 1975, to require one executive-level employee at the Department of Corrections be the deputy commissioner for prisoner rehabilitation; relating to pardons and paroles; to require one executive-level employee at the agency responsible for pardons and paroles be assigned as the deputy director for parolee rehabilitation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 14-1-1.5, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$14-1-1.5.

may appoint no more than three deputy commissioners who shall serve at his <u>or her</u> pleasure, and to define their duties. The deputy commissioners shall be persons of good character, of good business, educational or administrative experience, shall have no financial interest in any partnership, corporation, or association with which the department has any financial dealings and shall devote their full time to their official position and shall have no other lucrative position while serving as such. Their salaries shall be set by the commissioner but shall not exceed the salary paid the commissioner.

"(b) One deputy commissioner shall be known as the deputy commissioner for prisoner rehabilitation. The deputy commissioner for prisoner rehabilitation shall be responsible

1	for the development, implementation, and improvement of
2	programs designed to reduce recidivism."
3	Section 2. One executive-level employee at the
4	Department of Pardons and Paroles, or its successor agency,
5	shall be known as the deputy director for parolee
6	rehabilitation. The deputy director for parolee
7	rehabilitation shall be responsible for the development,
8	implementation, and improvement of programs designed to reduce
9	recidivism.
10	Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
11	first day of the third month following its passage and
12	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
