5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

6 Section 1. The following amendment to the 7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become 8 valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of 9 this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

All vacancies in the Office of Judge of the District Court of Dallas County which occur subsequent to January 15, 2021, shall be filled pursuant to the provisions of this amendment.

15 Section 2. (a) The Dallas County Judicial Commission 16 is created for the purpose of nominating to the Governor, 17 persons for appointment to any vacancy in the Office of Judge 18 of the District Court of Dallas County. The commission shall 19 be composed of the following:

(1) Two persons who are members of the Alabama State
Bar to be elected by attorneys licensed to practice law in
this state who reside in Dallas County. The executive
committee of the Dallas County local bar association or its
successor body in the capacity, is authorized and directed to
make rules, not inconsistent with this amendment, for the
election of the two members. The executive committee shall

certify in writing to the Judge of Probate of Dallas County
 the names of the two persons elected.

3 (2) Two persons who are not members of the Alabama
4 State Bar to be elected by the members of the Dallas County
5 Legislative Delegation. The members of the Dallas County
6 Legislative Delegation shall certify in writing to the Judge
7 of Probate of Dallas County the names of the two persons
8 elected.

9 (3) One judge of the Circuit Court of the Fourth 10 Judicial Circuit to be elected by the Circuit Judges of the 11 Fourth Judicial Circuit. The judges of the circuit court shall 12 certify in writing to the Judge of Probate of Dallas County 13 the name of the circuit judge elected.

(b) The Judge of Probate of Dallas County shall
record all certificates of election and safely and permanently
keep the original certificates. Upon receipt and recordation
of each certificate, the judge of probate shall send a
certified copy of the certificate to the Governor.

(c) All members of the commission, except the
 circuit judge, shall reside in the territorial jurisdiction of
 the District Court of Dallas County.

22 Section 3. The terms of office of all members of the 23 commission shall be six years, except that the initial terms 24 of office of the two members of the state bar shall be one and 25 two years respectively, and the initial terms of office for 26 the two members who are not members of the state bar shall be 27 three and four years respectively, and the initial term of the

circuit judge elected by the circuit judges shall be for five 1 2 years. The length of each initial term of office shall be 3 designated by the electing bodies. The terms of the initial members of the commission shall begin on January 16, 2021. A 4 5 vacancy in the office of a member of the commission shall be 6 filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the member 7 was originally chosen. No member of the commission shall be 8 eligible to serve consecutive terms.

9 Section 4. A member of the commission may not 10 receive any salary or other compensation for serving as a member. A member of the commission other than the member 11 12 required to be a judge of the circuit court may not hold any 13 public office or any official position in any political party. A member of the commission is not eligible for nomination to 14 15 the Governor for appointment as judge of the district court within six months of being a member of the commission. 16

Section 5. If, subsequent to January 15, 2021, a 17 18 vacancy occurs in the Office of Judge of the District Court of Dallas County, the commission, within 60 days, shall nominate 19 20 to the Governor three persons having the qualifications for 21 the office. The nominations shall be made only by the 22 concurrence of a majority of the members of the commission. If 23 the commission fails to nominate three persons during the 24 60-day period, the names shall be selected by the Chief 25 Justice or Acting Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court 26 within 10 days. The Governor shall appoint to the office in 27 which the vacancy exists one of the three persons nominated.

1 The appointee shall hold the office until a successor elected 2 at the next general election for any state officer held at 3 least six months after the vacancy occurs takes office.

4 Section 6. An election upon the proposed amendment 5 shall be held in accordance with Section 284.01 of the 6 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 7 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 8 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 9 state.

Section 7. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

15 "Relating to Dallas County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that 16 vacancies in the Office of District Court Judge in Dallas 17 18 County, are filled by the Governor based on nominations made by the Dallas County Judicial Commission and the appointee 19 20 holds office until the next general election for any state 21 officer held at least six months after the vacancy occurs. "Proposed by Act " 22 This description shall be followed by the following 23

24 language:

25 "Yes () No ()."

Section 8. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
