1 2 ENROLLED, An Act, Relating to Lamar County; to amend Section 3 45-38-71.01 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide 4 5 for the sale or disposal of tangible personal property, 6 equipment, and other items under the control of the county commission. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 8 Section 1. Section 45-38-71.01 of the Code of 9 10 Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 11 "§45-38-71.01. "(a) This section shall only apply in Lamar County. 12 13 "(b)(1) All contracts for the sale or disposal of 14 real property, tangible personal property, equipment, or other 15 items owned by or under the control of the county commission 16 shall be let by free and open competitive sealed bids. The 17 chair of the county commission shall certify to the description and condition of the property, shall give 18 19 jurisdiction in writing for the disposal of the property, shall estimate the value of the property, and shall keep the 20 21 certification as a part of the permanent record of the 22 commission. However, tangible personal property, equipment, or 23 other items owned by or under the control of the county 24 commission may be sold at public auction once a year after 25 sufficient notice of the auction has been given by the county

1 commission. Tangible personal property, equipment, or other
2 items owned by or under the control of the county commission
3 which has trade-in value may be offered as a credit against
4 the cost of property purchased in accordance with the Alabama
5 Competitive Bid Law.

6 "(2) Every proposal to make a sale covered by this 7 section shall be publicly advertised for four consecutive 8 weeks in a newspaper of countywide circulation and advertised one time in a newspaper of statewide circulation not less than 9 10 seven days in advance of the date fixed for closing the 11 receipt of bids. The advertisements shall state a description 12 of the property to be sold along with the date, time, and 13 place of opening of the sealed bids.

14 "(c) All bids shall be publicly owned opened and all 15 bidders shall be entitled to be present at the bid opening in 16 person or by representative. Any agreement or collusion among 17 bidders or prospective bidders or any other person in restraint of freedom of competition, by any agreement to bid 18 19 at a fixed price or to refrain from bidding, shall render the bids of such bidders void and shall cause such bidders to be 20 21 disgualified from submitting further bids on the sale. Any 22 disclosure prior to opening the sealed bids or the terms of a 23 bid shall render the proceedings void.

24 "(d) In lieu of the bidding procedures provided in
25 subsections (a), (b), and (c), tangible personal property,

equipment, or other items owned by or under the control of the
county commission may be sold at a public auction by public
bidding once a year. The date, time, and location of the
auction shall be publicly advertised for four consecutive
weeks in advance of the auction. A list of the items to be
auctioned shall be available in the offices of the county
commission.

8 "(d)(e) All proceeds from the sale or other 9 disposition of the property under this section shall be 10 deposited in the fund of the district owning the property or 11 the general fund of the county, if the property was owned by 12 the county.

13 "(e)(f) Anyone who knowingly violates this section 14 shall be guilty of a Class B felony and upon conviction shall 15 be fined up to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) and may be 16 imprisoned in the state penitentiary for up to seven years.

17 "(f)(g) Any taxpayer of the area within the 18 jurisdiction of the county and any bona fide unsuccessful 19 bidder on a particular contract shall be empowered to bring a 20 civil action in the appropriate court to enjoin execution of 21 any contract entered into in violation of this section."

22 Section 2. This act shall become effective 23 immediately following its passage and approval by the 24 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
