24	Relating to public lodging establishments; to
25	require human trafficking awareness training for all
26	employees; to require human trafficking awareness signs to be
27	posted at the establishments; to provide for a limitation of

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liability for reports of human trafficking and for 1 2 establishments in compliance with this act; and to provide for the enforcement by the Attorney General, including the 3 assessment of civil fines. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 5 Section 1. Every operator of a public lodging 6 7 establishment shall provide human trafficking awareness 8 training to each employee of the establishment. Every employee shall receive the training within 180 days of employment or 9 10 within 180 days of the effective date of this act. For purposes of this act, the term "public lodging establishment" 11 means an establishment that is subject to the lodging tax 12 13 pursuant to Chapter 26 of Title 40, Code of Alabama 1975. 14 Section 2. (a) Human trafficking awareness training 15 shall include, but is not limited to, the following: (1) The definition of human trafficking and 16 17 commercial exploitation of children. 18 (2) Guidance on how to identify individuals at risk for trafficking. 19 20 (3) Guidance on how to identify the signs of 21 trafficking and individuals potentially engaged in 22 trafficking. (4) Differences between labor and sex trafficking 23 24 specific to public lodging establishments. 25 (5) Guidance on the role of employees in public 26 lodging establishments in reporting and responding to human trafficking issues. 27

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1 (6) The contact information for the National Human 2 Trafficking Hotline toll-free number and text line or contact 3 information for the local law enforcement agency having 4 primary jurisdiction in the area.

5 (b) Any person who owns or operates a public lodging 6 establishment within the state shall annually certify to the 7 Alabama Department of Public Health no later than December 31 8 of each year that all employees employed by the public lodging 9 establishment more than 180 days have completed the training 10 required by this section.

Section 3. By October 1, 2020, every operator of a 11 public lodging establishment shall post human trafficking 12 13 awareness signage in a location conspicuous to employees, 14 printed in an easily legible font in English and any other 15 language spoken by more than 10 percent of the employees. 16 Lodging establishments with no employees shall post the signage in a location that is conspicuous to anyone in the 17 18 establishment.

19 Section 4. (a) By October 1, 2020, every operator of 20 a public lodging establishment shall implement procedures for 21 the reporting of suspected human trafficking to the National 22 Human Trafficking Hotline or to local law enforcement and 23 shall implement a human trafficking prevention policy which 24 shall apply to all employees.

(b) Any person who, in good faith, reports suspected
 human trafficking is immune from liability for making the
 report.

Section 5. An owner, operator, or employee of a public lodging establishment who complies in good faith with this act shall not be liable for any act or omission arising out of or related to human trafficking committed by a third party unless the owner or an operator or employee of the public lodging establishment knowingly assists in the commission of human trafficking.

Section 6. (a) The Alabama Department of Public 8 Health shall maintain a list which shall be available to other 9 10 state agencies of public lodging establishments that determined to be out of compliance with this act. The 11 department shall provide a public lodging establishment 90 12 13 days to cure any violation of this act prior to inclusion on 14 the out-of-compliance list. If a public lodging establishment 15 fails to cure this violation within the 90 days, the 16 department shall notify the Attorney General's Office of the 17 violation.

(b) For the purpose of making payments for lodging
expenses, all state agencies shall ensure that, to the extent
practicable, any commercial lodging room nights for employees
of state agencies are booked in a public lodging establishment
that is in compliance with this act.

(c) The Attorney General shall adopt a rule
establishing a schedule of civil fines for violation of this
act and may assess fines and collect any fines assessed for
violations of this act. All fines collected for violations of
this act shall be deposited in a fund established by the

1 Alabama Human Trafficking Task Force and are continuously 2 appropriated to the task force to carry out the purposes of 3 this act and to increase awareness of human trafficking in 4 this state.

5 Section 7. This act shall become effective on 6 October 1, 2020, following its passage and approval by the 7 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
