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governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote

unless: it comes within one of a number of 1 2 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 3 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 4 5 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 6 7 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. 4 Section 1. Section 16-28-4 of the Code of Alabama 5 1975, is amended to read as follows:

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"§16-28-4.

7 "(a) A child who is six years of age on or before December 31 or the date on which school begins in the 8 enrolling district shall be entitled to admission to the first 9 10 grade in the public elementary schools at the opening of such schools for that school year or as soon as practicable 11 12 thereafter. A child who is under six years of age on December 13 31 or the date on which school begins in the enrolling 14 district shall not be entitled to admission to the first grade 15 in the public elementary schools during that school year; 16 except, that an underage child who transfers from the first 17 grade of a school in another state may be admitted to school 18 upon approval of the board of education in authority, and an 19 underage child who has moved into this state having completed 20 or graduated from a mandated kindergarten program in another 21 state shall be entitled to admission to the public elementary 22 schools regardless of age. A child who becomes six years of 23 age on or before February 1 may, on approval of the local 24 board of education, be admitted at the beginning of the second 25 semester of that school year to schools in school systems 26 having semiannual promotions of pupils.

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"(b)(a) Except as otherwise provided by law:

1 "(1) A child who is five years of age on or before
2 September 1 or the date on which school begins in the
3 enrolling district shall be entitled to admission to the local
4 public school kindergartens enroll in kindergarten at the
5 opening of such schools for that school year or as soon as
6 practicable thereafter; a.

7 "(2) A child who is under five years of age on September 1 or the date on which school begins in the 8 enrolling district shall not be entitled to admission to such 9 10 schools during that school year; except that, an underage child who transfers from the public school kindergarten in 11 12 another state may be admitted to local public kindergarten on 13 the prior approval of the local board of education on a space 14 available basis. The aforementioned underage children 15 transferring from the public school kindergartens of another 16 state, upon successful completion of the kindergarten in the local public schools, will then be allowed admission to the 17 18 first grade of the local public schools as provided in 19 subsection (b). 20 "(b) An underage child may be admitted to public 21 kindergarten, on approval of the local board of education on a 22 space available basis, in either of the following 23 circumstances: 24 "(1) The underage child transfers from a public 25 kindergarten in another state. "(2) The child will turn five years of age between 26 September 1 and December 31, and the child satisfies certain 27
