27	PROPOSED AMENDMENT

1 (a) This amendment shall apply only in Talladega 2 County. (b) For the purposes of this amendment, "septage" 3 means any liquid or materials removed during the pumping of a 4 5 domestic onsite sewage disposal system, including sewage, a mixture of sewage, sludge, fatty materials, and human feces. 6 (c) In Talladega County, septage may not be applied on land as a fertilizer or soil amendment or otherwise. 8 9 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 10 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 284.01 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 11 284 and 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the 12 13 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state. 14 15 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 16 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 17 18 following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment: 19 2.0 "Relating to Talladega County, proposing an 21 amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that septage may not be applied on land as a fertilizer or 22 soil amendment or otherwise. 23 "Proposed by Act _____." 24 25 This description shall be followed by the following 26 language: "Yes () No ()."
