2 ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to Cullman County; to amend Sections 1 and 2 of Act 469 of the 1977 Regular Session (Acts 1977, p. 612), to provide for the election of two additional associate commissioners of the county commission; to amend Section 45-22-71 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the operation of the county roads on the county unit system; to further provide for the compensation of the associate commissioners of the county commission; and to repeal Section 45-22-70 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the associate county commissioners of the county commissioners of the county.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of Act 469 of the 1977 Regular Session (Acts 1977, p. 612), are amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. (a) After the effective date of this act

Effective until the end of the term of the members of the

county commission expiring in November 2022, the county

commission of Cullman County shall be composed of three

members who shall be nominated and elected by the qualified

electors of the county at large. One member shall be elected

for each district defined herein and such the member shall be

a resident and elector of the district from which such the

member is elected; however, the chairman chair of said the

commission shall be a resident and elector from anywhere in said the county. The powers, duties, terms, compensation, and manner of election for the members of said the commission shall be the same as now provided by law, except as otherwise herein provided, and the incumbent commissioners commissioners shall continue to serve until the expiration of their current terms at which time his or her successor shall qualify as herein provided.

"(b) (1) Effective for the term of the Associate

Commissioners of the Cullman County Commission commencing in

November 2022, the Cullman County Commission shall be composed
of a chair and four associate commissioners who shall be
nominated and elected by the qualified electors of the county
at large.

(2) One associate commissioners shall be elected for each district defined herein and each associate commissioner shall be a resident and elector of the district which the member represents. The districts of the county commission shall be designated Commission District One; Commission District Two; Commission District Three; and Commission District Four. In order to stagger the terms of the associate commissions, the associate commissioners initially elected from Commission District Three and Commission District Four shall be elected for an initial term of two years and the associate commissioners elected from Commission District One

1	and Commission District Two shall be elected for a term of
2	four years. Thereafter, successors shall be elected for terms
3	of four years. The associate county commissioners shall serve
4	on a part-time basis.
5	(3) The Chair of the Cullman County Commission shall
6	continue to be a resident and elector from anywhere in the
7	county and shall serve on a full-time basis. The chair of the
8	county commission shall continue to serve a four-year term.
9	(4) The powers, duties, terms, and manner of
10	election for the members of the commission shall be the same
11	as now provided by law, except as provided otherwise in this
12	section. The chair of the county commission may not vote
13	except in the case of a tie vote of the associate
14	commissioners.
15	(5) Effective beginning in November 2020, the county
16	commission shall hold at least one meeting of the commission
17	each month after 6:00 p.m., in order to encourage members of
18	the working public to attend commission meetings.
19	"Section 2. <u>(a)</u> Commissioner Commission District One
20	is described as follows: That area of the county which lies to
21	the East of U.S. Highway 31 and North of U.S. Highway 278.
22	"(b) Commissioner Commission District Two is
23	described as follows: That area of the county which lies to

the West of U.S. Highway 31 and North of U.S. Highway 278.

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1	"(c) Commission District Three is described as
2	follows: That area of the county which lies East of U.S.
3	Highway 31 and South of U.S. Highway 278.
4	"(d) Commission District Four is described as
5	follows: That area of the county which lies West of U.S.
6	Highway 31 and South of U.S. Highway 278."
7	Section 2. Section 45-22-71 of the Code of Alabama
8	1975, is amended to read as follows:
9	"§45-22-71.
10	"The Cullman County Commission or like governing
11	body of Cullman County shall be solely responsible for the
12	construction, repair, and maintenance of the roads and bridges
13	in the county; but all such construction, repair, and
14	maintenance shall be done on the basis of the county as a
15	unit, without regard to district or quadrant lines, and under
16	the supervision of an engineer or other qualified road
17	supervisor. The county governing body shall have all the
18	powers and jurisdiction with respect to county roads and
19	bridges which are or which hereafter may be vested in or
20	required of county governing bodies by the general laws of
21	this state, or vested in or required of the governing body of
22	Cullman County by local law: and except as may be otherwise
23	provided herein members of the county governing body of
24	Cullman County shall perform all the duties and services and
25	shall exercise all the powers and authority with respect to

the construction, repair, and maintenance of county roads and
bridges which are or hereafter may be provided by law for
members of county governing bodies. The county engineer shall
be responsible for the day-to-day operation of the county road
department on a unit basis and shall carry out policy and
projects of the county in accordance with decisions of the
county commission by a majority vote except in the case of a
tie vote, in which case the chair of the county commission may
vote. The county engineer shall report on a regular basis to
the chair in the organizational structure of the county and
the chair shall keep the remainder of the county commission
informed on the operation of the county road department."

Section 3. (a) Effective beginning the next term of office of the Associate Commissioners of the Cullman County Commission commencing in November 2022, the Associate Commissioners of the Cullman County Commission shall receive a salary of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) per year, payable from the general fund of the county. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any associate commissioner serving on the effective date of the act adding this language who continues to be reelected for consecutive terms shall continue to receive the same salary he or she is receiving on that date as long as the commissioner is reelected for consecutive terms.

(b) The Chair of the Cullman County Commission shall continue to receive the same salary per year payable in equal

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1	monthly installments from the general fund of the county as
2	provided in the effective date of this act.
3	(c) The chair and the associate commissioners of the
4	county commission shall be entitled to participate in the
5	county health insurance program without costs to the member.
6	Section 4. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
7	with this act are repealed. Section 45-22-70 of the Code of
8	Alabama 1975, is specifically repealed effective beginning the
9	next term of office of the associate commissioners of the
10	county commission commencing in November, 2022.
11	Section 5. This act shall become effective
12	immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
