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8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, certain funds derived
9 from fees and taxes relating to the licensing, use,
10 and operation of motor vehicles and motor vehicle
11 fuels may only be used for the construction,
12 maintenance, and repair of public highways and
13 bridges, and for costs related to traffic

regulation and enforcement.

This bill would propose an amendment to
Amendment 93, as amended by Amendment 354, to the
Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as
Section 111.06 of the Official Recompilation of the
Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to
allow the Legislature to distribute any motor fuel
excise taxes levied under the "Rebuild Alabama Act"
Act 2019-2, 2019 First Special Session, to the
Department of Commerce for a small business
stimulus fund for a period of two years after the
ratification of the amendment, after which time it
would revert back to its original purpose under
general law. The department shall promulgate rules

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
17	Section 1. The following amendment to the
18	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and
19	shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a
20	majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in
21	accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution
22	of Alabama of 1901, as amended:
23	PROPOSED AMENDMENT
24	"Amendment 93, as amended by Amendment 354.
25	"(a) No moneys derived from any fees, excises, or
26	license taxes, levied by the state, relating to registration,
27	operation, or use of vehicles upon the public highways except

a vehicle-use tax imposed in lieu of a sales tax, and no 1 2 moneys derived from any fee, excises, or license taxes, levied by the state, relating to fuels used for propelling such 3 vehicles except pump taxes, shall be expended for other than 5 cost of administering such laws, statutory refunds and adjustments allowed therein, cost of construction, 6 7 reconstruction, maintenance and repair of public highways and bridges, costs of highway rights-of-way, payment of highway obligations, the cost of traffic regulation, and the expense 9 10 of enforcing state traffic and motor vehicle laws. The provisions of this amendment shall not apply to any such fees, 11 excises, or license taxes now levied by the state for school 12 13 purposes for this whole state or for any county or city board of education therein; and the legislature may provide for the 14 15 manufacture, distribution and use on private passenger or pleasure motor vehicles of personalized license plates or 16 tags, bearing some special letters, figures, mark or badge of 17 18 distinction or personal prestige in lieu of the regular license plates or tags, and if it does so, the legislature 19 20 must also require that such tags may be procured only by 21 payment of a fee or charge, in addition to the regular fee, 22 excise or license tax for the registration, operation or use 23 of such motor vehicles upon the highways. The moneys derived 24 from the additional charge made for such special or 25 distinctive license plates or tags, in excess of the cost of the manufacture and distribution of such plates or tags, may 26 27 be used in such manner as the legislature prescribes.

(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the Legislature shall distribute the portion of the motor fuel excise taxes levied under the Rebuild Alabama Act, Act 2019-2, 2019 First Special Session, to the Alabama Department of Commerce to create a small business stimulus fund for a period of two years upon ratification of this amendment, after which time the distribution of the motor fuel excise tax levies contained in the Rebuild Alabama Act shall revert back to its original purpose under general law. The Alabama Department of Commerce shall promulgate rules on how the monies in the small business stimulus fund will be distributed.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to allow the Legislature to distribute any motor fuel excise taxes levied under the "Rebuild Alabama Act" Act 2019-2, 2019 First Special Session, to the Department of Commerce for a small business stimulus

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fund for a period of two years after the ratification of the
amendment, after which time it shall revert back to its
original purpose under general law.
