WHEREAS, in 2018, tech-related employment in Alabama 3 increased by nearly 1,900 new workers, net tech employment 4 grew by an estimated 1,888 jobs, a 1.3 percent increase over 5 6 2017, and the tech sector raised its contributions to the state's economy; since 2010, net tech employment has grown by 7 8 over 10,000 new jobs with more than 147,000 workers; tech accounts for approximately 7.1 percent of Alabama's workforce; 9 10 also, the tech sector had an estimated direct economic impact 11 of \$13.4 billion, which is about 6.8 percent of Alabama's 12 total economy; and

13 WHEREAS, tens of thousands of people rely on 14 technology in the workplace; the broad-based impact of the 15 tech industry touches every community, company, and industry 16 market across Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Alabama has seen a 57 percent increase in the number of job postings related to emerging technologies, smart cities, drones, artificial intelligence, virtual and augmented reality, and blockchain; and

21 WHEREAS, by the year 2026, net tech employment will 22 grow by 6.8 percent in Alabama; and

23 WHEREAS, multiple tech occupations in Alabama have 24 experienced yearly growth, including over 3.7 percent for 25 software and web developers, over 3.1 percent for computer

support specialists, and over one percent for network
architects, administrators, and support specialists; the
median tech occupation wage is \$77,956, which is 109 percent
higher than the median wage for all occupations in the State;
