16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to the state Emergency Management Agency;
19	to require the agency to develop guidelines for the volunteer
20	designation of safer place facilities throughout the state to
21	protect individuals during severe weather events.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. (a) Before December 31, 2021, the state
24	Emergency Management Agency, in cooperation with the Alabama
25	Association of Emergency Managers and the Association of
26	County Commissions of Alabama, shall develop uniform
27	guidelines for use in identifying and volunteering safer place

facilities throughout the state. At a minimum, the guidelines
 shall do all of the following:

3 (1) Provide local emergency management agencies with
4 methods for notifying the community about safer places.

5 (2) Provide an application process, through the local emergency management agency, for those individuals and 6 7 entities that own or control a structure for offering all or part of the structure for designation as a safer place 8 9 facility. At a minimum, the application shall require the 10 applicant to make a good faith determination that the structure meets all criteria identified by the guidelines and 11 that the applicant will not discriminate when making the 12 13 structure available to the public. The application may be provided through the website of the local emergency management 14 15 agency.

16 (3) Describe the circumstances and conditions of
17 appropriate use and length of availability of a safer place
18 facility.

19 (4) Require that the availability of a safer place
20 will be nondiscriminatory on the basis of race, color,
21 national origin, age, disability, sex, or religion.

(5) Provide that a designated safer place facility
is not required to be available to the public at all times or
to provide staff, food, water, medicine, electricity, air
conditioning, first aid, telecommunication services, or any
other life or health preserving goods or services before,
during, or after a severe weather event.

(6) Provide a procedure for the withdrawal of a
 safer place designation.

3 (7) Require safer place facilities to satisfy
4 applicable building codes at the time of construction, provide
5 participants with improved protection from the elements, and
6 not pose a direct threat to the health and safety of those
7 participating including, but not limited to, the following:

a. A second means of exiting the facility in the
event of fire or other emergency.

b. Smoke detectors which comply with applicablebuilding codes.

c. Sufficient sanitary facilities that are in proper
 operating condition, are private, and are adequate for
 personal cleanliness and the disposal of human waste.

(8) Establish other procedures, criteria, and
guidelines as necessary to further the purposes of this
section.

(b) No state or local governmental entity shall
provide, or offer to provide, compensation or financial
support of any kind to any individual or entity relating to
the designation or operation of a safer place facility.

(c) Due to the patent and obvious dangers associated with severe weather events, an individual who uses a safer place facility does not acquire the status of an invitee or licensee, and the individual who uses a designated safer place facility does so at his or her own risk, with full knowledge and appreciation of the associated risks.

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1 (d) A local emergency management agency, pursuant to 2 its emergency management functions may perform any task provided in the guidelines. Any individual who volunteers a 3 structure as a safer place facility pursuant to this section 4 5 is a volunteer for purposes of the Volunteer Service Act, Section 6-5-336, Code of Alabama 1975, during the time the 6 7 structure is designated as a safer place. Any entity making a facility available as a safer place shall be afforded the same 8 9 protections granted to an emergency management worker, 10 individual, partnership, association, or corporation by Section 31-9-16, Code of Alabama 1975. 11

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective 13 immediately following its passage and approval by the 14 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
