1	Section 1. Sections 31-4-1 and 31-4-3 of the Code of
2	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

4	"The Governor of Alabama, the Adjutant General of
5	Alabama, the Attorney General of Alabama, the two highest
6	ranking Army National Guard officers, and the highest ranking
7	Air National Guard officer, together with three duly qualified
8	electors of Alabama, to be appointed by the Governor, and to
9	serve for a term of six years, shall constitute the Armory
10	Commission of Alabama. The Governor shall be its chairman. The
11	three members of the commission who were appointed by the
12	Governor and who are serving on May 12, 1977, shall serve for
13	a term of six years from the date of their appointment, and
14	their successors shall be appointed for a term of six years.
15	"(a) The Armory Commission of Alabama shall consist
16	of 15 members. The membership of the commission shall include

18	"(1) The Governor of Alabama.
19	"(2) The Adjutant General of Alabama.

- "(b) All appointments shall be for a term of six years. As terms expire, successor board members shall be appointed pursuant to subsection (a).
- "(c) The Governor shall be the chair of the commission.
- "(d) All appointing authorities shall coordinate
 their appointments so that diversity of gender, race, and
 geographical areas are reflective of the makeup of this state.
- "(e) All future appointments by an appointing authority shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate.

"The commission may in its corporate name sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, acquire real and personal property by gift, purchase, lease, hire, or condemnation, and may do all things and exercise all rights and powers reasonably necessary to carry out and perform the duties intended or required by this chapter. The members shall serve without compensation and shall be paid the expenses allowed by law while attending meetings of the commission or while traveling under orders for the performance of duty in connection with the business of the commission, the expense to be payable out of any funds available to the commission, or if the Governor so directs, out of the active military service appropriation. The commission shall hold regular or special meetings at Montgomery or other designated places at the

discretion and on call of the Governor, after reasonable 1 2 notice, at least twice per year. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the consideration of business. 3 The commission may delegate to an executive committee, 4 consisting of not less than three of its members, such of its 5 duties and authority as it may deem proper and advisable, not 7 inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter." Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 8 first day of the third month following its passage and 9 10 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
