This bill would include one senator and one 18 19 representative appointed to the commission by the 20 Lieutenant Governor from the minority caucus. 21 22 A BTLL 23 TO BE ENTITLED 24 AN ACT 25 26 Relating to the Alabama Job Creation and Military Stability Commission; to amend Section 31-14-3, Code of 27

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
6	Section 1. Section 31-14-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"§31-14-3.
9	"(a) There is created the Alabama Job Creation and
10	Military Stability Commission. Members of the commission shall
11	include a chair and two vice chairs. The chair shall be the
12	Lieutenant Governor, or in the absence of a Lieutenant
13	Governor, the chair shall be the Governor, or his or her
14	designee. The vice chairs shall be the President Pro Tempore
15	of the Senate, or his or her designee, and the Speaker of the
16	House of Representatives, or his or her designee.
17	"(b) The commission shall also consist of the
18	following members:
19	"(1) Two members of the House of Representatives
20	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
21	"(2) Two members of the Senate appointed by the
22	President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
23	"(3) The Adjutant General of the Alabama National
24	Guard.
25	"(4) The Secretary of the Alabama State Law
26	Enforcement Agency.
27	"(5) The Secretary of the Department of Commerce.

"(6) The Director of the Alabama Department of
 Economic and Community Affairs.

3 "(7) The Commissioner of the Alabama Department of
4 Veterans Affairs.

5 "(8) One senator from the minority caucus appointed
6 by the Lieutenant Governor.

7 "(9) One representative from the minority caucus
8 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

9 "(8)(10) One retired senior member of the Armed 10 Forces for each of the four major military facilities in Alabama, Redstone Arsenal, Anniston Army Depot, Maxwell Air 11 Force Base including the Gunter Annex, and Fort Rucker, who 12 13 shall be appointed by the Governor, after consultation with the individual designated in subdivision (9) (11) as the civic 14 15 leader from the community which the senior member of the 16 military shall represent.

17 "(9) (11) One civic leader with significant 18 experience in military relocations from each of the four 19 communities currently impacted most significantly by the 20 presence of military facilities and assigned personnel who 21 shall be appointed by the chair after consultation with the 22 existing organizations described in subsection (h).

"(c) Members of the commission shall serve for a term of four years with each appointment, may be reappointed for an unlimited number of terms, and shall serve on the commission until a replacement is appointed.

"(d) The members of the Alabama Job Creation and 1 2 Military Stability Commission created by Act 2011-350, as amended by Act 2013-156, shall be the initial members of the 3 commission created under this section and shall continue to 4 5 serve on the commission at the pleasure of the appointing 6 authority until the quadrennium commencing in 2019. Persons 7 appointed after the commencement of the quadrennium commencing in 2019 shall serve a term of four years. 8

9 "(e) The commission shall hold its organizational 10 meeting by August 31, 2017. Thereafter, the commission shall 11 meet at the call of the chair; provided, that the commission 12 shall meet at least once annually.

13 "(f) The commission shall adopt rules for its 14 governance, including, but not limited to, the filling of 15 vacancies, the election of officers, the creation of committees including an executive committee, and the execution 16 of documents. Members of the commission, the executive 17 18 committee of the commission, or any other committee established by the commission may participate in a meeting of 19 20 the commission or committee by means of telephone conference, 21 video conference, or using similar communications methods by 22 means of which all individuals participating in the meeting 23 may hear one another. Participation by such means shall 24 constitute presence in person at a meeting for all purposes, 25 including for purposes of establishing a quorum. Notice of 26 meetings must be provided in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act and similar means of communication be allowed to 27

1 provide for members of the public to listen and observe 2 meetings.

"(q) The Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the 3 House of Representatives, the Legislative Services Agency, 4 5 Legal Division, the Legislative Services Agency, Fiscal Division, and the Examiners of Public Accounts shall provide 6 7 assistance as requested by the commission. Each legislative member of the commission and supporting staff shall be 8 9 entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation and 10 his or her per diem and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission which shall be paid out of 11 any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, upon 12 13 warrants drawn on the Comptroller upon requisition signed by the commission's chair; provided, however, that members shall 14 15 not receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session but shall receive his or 16 17 her travel expenses for all meetings attended.

18 "(h) The commission shall make proactive attempts to ensure the stability of Alabama-assigned Department of Defense 19 20 resources by the study and evaluation of military 21 organizations, personnel, civilian support personnel, 22 equipment, and infrastructure currently located in the state, 23 and the re-stationing or reorganization of military resources 24 located in, relocating to, or outside of the state using the 25 following items of evaluation:

"(1) All Department of Defense personnel, assets, 1 2 and equipment, including that belonging to the Alabama National Guard and Reserve units or forces. 3 "(2) The economic impact of these resources on 4 5 surrounding communities. "(3) Current policies, programs, and services that 6 7 impact Department of Defense resources located in the state. "(4) The impact these Department of Defense assets 8 and resources have on state and local job creation. 9 10 "(5) The impact of Department of Defense assets and resources on local businesses and industry. 11 12 "(6) Funding available or required to promote the 13 sustained presence of Department of Defense assets and 14 resources appropriated to the state. 15 "(i) The commission shall not alter the purpose, replace, or change the role of any existing organization, task 16 17 force, or committee within a military community with the 18 purpose of promoting military growth including Base Closure and Realignment Commission associated actions. 19 20 "(j) The appointing authorities of the commission 21 shall coordinate their appointments to assure the membership 22 of the Alabama Job Creation and Military Stability Commission 23 is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, 24 urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state. 25 "(k) The commission shall make an annual report to members of the Legislature no later than the seventh 26

legislative day of each regular session beginning in 2018
 detailing all commission activities and recommendations.

3 "(1) The commission may accept gifts, contributions,
4 bequests, grants, and other donations, whether public or
5 private, of money, real property, or personal property and
6 shall expend the same in furtherance of the work of the
7 commission.

"(m) The work of the commission shall be supported 8 by the Military Stability Foundation, an Alabama nonprofit 9 10 corporation incorporated on September 8, 2011, which shall not be considered a government body. Documents produced by or for 11 such foundation shall not be considered public writings, even 12 13 if viewed by or delivered to the commission, as the disclosure of the documents would be detrimental to the best interest of 14 the public." 15

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
