10	Section 1. Section 41-4-177.10 is added to the Code
11	of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
12	§41-4-177.10. Data Collection.
13	(a) For purposes of this section, the following
14	terms shall have the following meanings:
15	(1) MINORITY INDIVIDUAL. An individual who is a
16	citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States, and
17	who is any of the following:
18	a. African American: An individual having origins in
19	any of the black racial groups of Africa.
20	b. Hispanic: An individual of Mexican, Puerto Rican,
21	Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or
22	origin, regardless of race.
23	c. Asian American: An individual having origins in
24	any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia,
25	the Indian subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands.
26	d. Native American: An individual having origins in
27	any of the original peoples of North America.

(2) MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESS. A for-profit business
 that is headquartered or has its principal place of business
 in the state, and that is any or either of the following:

a. An independently owned and operated business that
is at least 51 percent owned or controlled by one or more
minority individuals, a majority of whom have their permanent
place of residence in the state.

b. A publicly owned business of which at least 51
percent of the stock is owned and controlled by one or more
minority individuals and whose daily management and operations
are under the control of one or more of these minority
individuals, a majority of whom have their permanent place of
residence in the state.

14 (3) SMALL BUSINESS. A for-profit business that is 15 headquartered or has its principal place of business in the 16 state; that is independently owned and operated; and that 17 employs no more than 50 individuals on a full-time basis, a 18 majority of whom have their permanent place of residence in 19 the state.

20 (4) SMALL OR DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS. A small
21 business, a minority-owned business, or a woman-owned business
22 that is licensed to do business in the state.

(5) WOMAN-OWNED BUSINESS. A for-profit business that
is headquartered or has its principal place of business in the
state, and that is any or either of the following:

a. An independently owned and operated business thatis at least 51 percent owned or controlled by one or more

1 women, a majority of whom have their permanent place of 2 residence in the state.

b. A publicly owned business of which daily
management and operations are under the control of a woman or
group of women, a majority of whom have their permanent place
of residence in the state, and who own and control at least 51
percent of the stock of the business or an equivalent
ownership stake.

9 (b) The Chief Procurement Officer shall make
10 reasonable efforts to do all of the following:

(1) Obtain, from the Secretary of State, the Department of Labor, and other available sources, information regarding the small and disadvantaged businesses operating in the state, and maintain a database of the information received.

16 (2) Identify and record the goods or services that
 17 may reasonably be purchased by the state from the small or
 18 disadvantaged businesses operating in the state.

19 (3) Determine what proportion of procurement
20 contracts under this article are awarded to the small and
21 disadvantaged businesses in the state based upon the records
22 and information obtained by the Chief Procurement Officer.

(c) (1) The Chief Procurement Officer, by the end of
February of each year, shall provide to the Contract Review
Permanent Legislative Oversight Committee a summary of the
information and data gathered under this section.

(2) The Chief Procurement Officer and the Secretary
 of State, upon request, shall provide data collected and
 maintained under this section to the Legislative Services
 Agency.

5 Section 2. The Secretary of State shall adopt rules or establish internal office procedures to implement the 6 7 Office of the Secretary of State's responsibilities under this 8 act, which shall include reasonable efforts to identify small or disadvantaged businesses authorized by the Secretary of 9 10 State to do business within the state and the reporting of that data and information to the Chief Procurement Officer no 11 less than annually by January 31 of each year. 12

Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable.
If any part of this act is declared invalid or
unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
which remains.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, contingent upon the enactment of SB \_\_\_\_\_ of the 2021 Regular Session, creating the Office of Chief Procurement Officer.

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
