dollar and ten cents (\$1.10) when submitting his or her

9 9-11-68 and Section 9-11-69.

(h) Applications for lifetime licenses authorized by
this section shall be filed in the office of the Commissioner
of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources or as
otherwise authorized by the commissioner on forms prescribed
by the commissioner.

15 (i) Lifetime licenses issued pursuant to this16 section are not transferrable.

17 (j) Nonresidents of this state may not purchase the18 licenses provided for in this section.

19 (k) The holder of a valid disabled military 20 veteran's hunting or disabled military veteran's freshwater 21 fishing license shall also be entitled to all of the 22 privileges of the wildlife heritage license.

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 24 first day of the third month following its passage and 25 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
