21	determine the identity of an unknown individual, generates	
22	facial biometric data, searches for matching facial biometric	
23	data in a database populated with many individuals' facial	
24	biometric data linked to personally identifiable information,	
25	and provides match results based on the similarity between the	
26	unknown individual's facial biometric data and the facial	
27	biometric data in the database.	

1 (2) FACIAL BIOMETRIC DATA. A unique numerical
2 representation of an individual's face generated by facial
3 recognition technology based on measurements derived from a
4 facial image, also known as a facial template.

Section 2. (a) A state or local law enforcement agency may not use facial recognition technology match results as the sole basis to establish probable cause in a criminal investigation or to make an arrest.

(b) To establish probable cause in a criminal investigation or to make an arrest, a state or local law enforcement agency may use facial recognition technology match results only in conjunction with other lawfully obtained information and evidence.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
