18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
19	Section 1. Section 22-20-5.1, Code of Alabama 1975,		
20	is amended to read as follows:		
21	"§22-20-5.1.		
22	"(a) For purposes of this section, the following		
23	words have the following meanings:		
24	" (1) BAKED GOOD. Includes cakes, breads, Danish,		
25	donuts, pastries, pies, and other items that are prepared by		
26	baking the item in an oven. A baked good does not include a		

1	potentially hazardous food item as defined by rule of the		
2	department.		
3	"(1) COTTAGE FOOD. A non-potentially hazardous food		
4	that has been prepared in a person's home that does not		
5	require time or temperature control for safety to limit		
6	pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation and that		
7	does not include meat, poultry, or fish, including the		
8	following:		
9	a. Cakes, breads, Danish pastries, donuts, pastries,		
10	and pies.		
11	b. Jam, jellies, and fruit preserves.		
12	<u>c. Candy.</u>		
13	d. Dried and dehydrated herbs, herb mixes,		
14	vegetables, or fruits.		
15	e. Roasted coffee.		
16	f. Dried baking mixes.		
17	g. Fermented or preserved vegetables or fruit that		
18	do not result in the production of alcohol and that have an		
19	acidity level allowed by the department.		
20	"(2) COTTAGE FOOD PRODUCTION OPERATION. A person		
21	operating out of his or her home who meets all of the		
22	following requirements:		
23	"a. Produces a baked good, a canned jam or jelly, a		
24	dried herb or herb mix, or a candy <u>cottage food</u> for sale at		
25	the person's home.		

1 "b. Has an annual gross income of twenty thousand 2 dollars (\$20,000) or less from the sale of food described in 3 paragraph a. "(c) b. Sells the foods produced under paragraph a. 4 5 only directly to consumers, whether in-person, by phone, or online in the state. 6 7 "c. Delivers the foods produced under paragraph a. 8 directly to consumers in the state, whether in person, through an agent of the producer, or by mail. 9 10 "(3) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Public Health. 11 "(4) HOME. A primary residence that contains a 12 13 kitchen and appliances designed for common residential use. 14 "(b) A cottage food production operation is not a 15 food service establishment and is not required to have a food service permit issued by the county health department. 16 17 "(c) Neither the State Department of Public Health 18 nor a county health department may regulate the production of 19 food at a cottage food production operation except as provided 20 by this section. 21 "(d) The department may issue a stop sale, seize, or hold order for any food suspected of being the cause of a food 22 borne illness. 23 24 "(e) The department shall promulgate rules requiring a A cottage food production operation to shall label all baked 25 goods, canned jams or jellies, candies, and dried herb or herb 26 27 mix cottage foods that the operation sells to consumers, and

1 requiring completion of shall complete a food safety course 2 approved by the department. The label shall include in at 3 least size 10-point font the common or usual name of the food, the name, and home or P.O. Box address of the cottage food 4 5 production operation, and a statement that the food is not inspected by the department or local health department. The 6 7 label shall also contain a list of the ingredients in the food 8 in descending order of predominance and shall include a 9 disclaimer that the food may contain allergens. The operator 10 of a cottage food production operation, shall maintain certification of having attended and passed a food safety 11 12 course approved by the department.

13 "(f) A cottage food production operation may not 14 sell baked goods, jams and jellies, candies, or dried herbs 15 and herb mixes over the Internet."

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
