27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. (a) The Legislative Council may review 2 any executive order issued by the President of the United States and recommend to the Attorney General and the Governor 3 that the executive order be further reviewed. Upon 5 recommendation from the Legislative Council, the Attorney General shall review the executive order to determine the 6 7 constitutionality of the order and whether the state should seek an exemption from the application of the order or seek to 8 have the order declared to be an unconstitutional exercise of 9 10 legislative authority by the President.

- (b) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state or a political subdivision of the state, or an agency thereof, may not implement an executive order that the Attorney General determines to be an unconstitutional restriction of a person's rights under subsection (a) and which relates to any of the following:
- (1) Epidemics, pandemics, or other health emergencies.
- (2) The regulation of natural resources, including coal and oil.
  - (3) The regulation of the agriculture industry.
  - (4) The use of land.

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- (5) The regulation of the financial sector as it relates to environmental, social, or governance standards.
- 25 (6) The regulation of the constitutional right to 26 keep and bear arms.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
