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- 2 ENROLLED, An Act,

To make an appropriation of \$40,368,723 from the 3 Children First Trust Fund for the fiscal year ending September 4 5 30, 2022, to the entities and for the purposes designated in 6 Section 41-15B-2.2, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide for the deposit of tobacco settlement revenues into the Children First 7 8 Trust Fund; to require written notification of anticipated 9 agency allocations by the State Director of Finance; to 10 require quarterly allocations; to condition allocations on 11 receipt of tobacco revenues; to provide for the transfer to the State General Fund during fiscal year 2022 that portion of 12 13 Children First Trust Fund receipts currently allocated for the 14 State Board of Education; to make an appropriation of 15 \$47,110,312 from other tobacco settlement funds for the fiscal 16 year ending September 30, 2022; and to make a conditional 17 appropriation and allocation of additional tobacco revenues upon the recommendation of the Director of Finance, the 18 19 Chairman of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Chairman of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General 20 21 Fund Committee, and the approval of the Governor. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 22

23 Section 1. (a) There is hereby appropriated from the 24 Children First Trust Fund the sum of \$40,368,723 for the fis-25 cal year ending September 30, 2022, to the entities and for

the purposes designated in Section 41-15B-2.2, Code of Alabama 1975 as follows, per the approved plan of investment for each agency:

(b) (1) All tobacco revenues from the tobacco
settlement received by the state previously designated for the
Children First Trust Fund shall be deposited to the Children
First Trust Fund within 30 calendar days of receipt of those
tobacco revenues.

(2) The Director of Finance shall notify each agency
 and the Department of Early Childhood Education in writing

prior to September 1, 2021, of the dollar amount of the allocation expected to be received by the agency from the Children First Trust Fund in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022.

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(3) At the beginning of each quarter of the fiscal 5 6 year ending September 30, 2022, the respective agency shall be allocated at least one-fourth of the total amount appropriated 7 8 and allocated to the agency for that fiscal year when tobacco 9 revenues are available for the respective agency. In the event 10 tobacco revenues are not available for the respective agency 11 until later in the fiscal year then the respective agency 12 shall be allocated an equal quarterly allotment for the 13 quarters that funds are available at the beginning of those 14 quarters. Such allocation shall be made and be available for 15 expenditure by the agency within five working days of the 16 commencement of the quarter. If additional sums are 17 appropriated or allocated, or both, during the fiscal year, 18 these sums shall be equally allocated to the respective agency 19 among the remaining quarters of the fiscal year or may be 20 allocated to the respective agency in one sum if revenues are 21 available. The Department of Early Childhood Education shall 22 be notified in writing of all appropriations and allocations 23 from the Children First Trust Fund by the Director of Finance.

(4) Allocations from the Children First Trust Fund
 are conditioned upon the receipt of tobacco revenues.

(c) Allocations received pursuant to Section 1 shall
 be expended in accordance with Section 41-15B-2.2, Code of
 Alabama 1975.

4 (d) At the conclusion of the fiscal year, any
5 remaining sums in the Children First Trust Fund shall remain
6 in the fund and shall not revert to the General Fund or to any
7 other fund.

8 Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of Division 1 of Article 17 of Chapter 10 of Title 41, Code of Alabama 9 10 1975, any provision of Chapter 15B of Title 41, Code of 11 Alabama 1975, or any other provision of law, that portion of Children First Trust Fund receipts currently allocated for the 12 State Board of Education shall be transferred from the 13 14 Children First Trust Fund to the State General Fund during the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022. 15

Section 3. In addition to the appropriation herein above made, there is hereby appropriated from additional tobacco settlement funds the sum of \$47,110,312 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 to the following entities:

2 Section 4. Any additional tobacco revenues available 3 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, shall be 4 conditionally appropriated, conditioned upon the 5 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairman of the 6 House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Chairman 7 of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and 8 approval of the Governor.

9 Section 5. The Executive Budget Office and the 10 Director of Finance shall allot funds appropriated from the 11 Children First Trust Fund only following the certification by 12 the Commissioner of the Department of Early Childhood 13 Education that a plan of investment has been approved for each agency. The Commissioner of the Department of Early Childhood 14 15 Education shall prescribe the form and format on which each 16 agency receiving appropriated funds herein shall submit a plan 17 of investment of said appropriated funds. The plan of investment shall include, but not be limited to, a minimum of 18 19 four (4) quality assurance items on which a periodic report, 20 as required by the approved plan of investment, is made and as 21 audited by the Examiners of Public Accounts. Quality assurance items shall include the number of children receiving service, 22 23 an identifiable measure of success of services provided and a 24 prioritized standard of successful measures for future plans

1 of investment. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 2 Commissioner of the Department of Early Childhood Education shall be responsible for providing a standard of measurement 3 by which a clear determination can be made through operational 4 5 reporting and audit reporting of a measurable success of funds 6 appropriated and invested from the Children First Trust Fund; 7 insure funds appropriated herein are invested in viable 8 programs; insure and promote the leverage of appropriated 9 funds herein in every possible manner and coordinated in all 10 possible ways the investment of funds by each service provider 11 to insure that no unproductive expenditures or duplication occurs. The Commissioner of the Department of Early Childhood 12 13 Education shall notify legislators representing the area where 14 a grant from the Children First Trust Fund is designated. The 15 notification shall occur ten days before the funds reach the 16 recipient agency.

17 Section 6. The Commissioner of the Department of 18 Early Childhood Education shall report each approved plan of 19 investment to the Joint Interim Legislative Oversight Committee and the Alabama Children's Policy Council. The 20 21 Commissioner, upon the request of the service agency, may 22 approve an adjusted plan of investment. It is the intent of 23 the Legislature that funds appropriated from the Children 24 First Trust Fund be directed to meet the most immediate needs 25 of children as changing conditions may develop.

1	Section 7. Should any provision of this act be held
2	invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining
3	provisions of the act.
4	Section 8. This act shall become effective
5	immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or
6	upon its otherwise becoming a law.
