24	Section 1. Section 34-4-3 of the Code of Alabama
25	1975, is amended to read as follows:
26	"§34-4-3.

"(a) The provisions of this chapter and the terms 1 2 "auctioneer," "apprentice auctioneer," and "auction business or business of auctioneering," as defined in Section 34-4-2, 3 shall not apply to and shall not include any person acting as 4 5 a receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, guardian, administrator, or executor or any such person acting under order of any court, 6 7 nor shall they include a trustee acting under a trust 8 agreement, deed of trust, or will, nor shall they include 9 sales at auction conducted by or under the direction of any 10 public authority or pursuant to any judicial order or decree. "(b) In addition to subsection (a), this chapter 11 12 does not apply to any sales through an Internet website that 13 uses computer automation to accept competitive bids and a 14 countdown clock to determine when bidding ends, in lieu of an

15 <u>auctioneer to call bids.</u>"

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
