23	under the PACT Program from 10 years to 12 years after the

25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 16-33C-7, Code of Alabama 1975,
27	is amended to read as follows:

"§16-33C-7. 1 2 "(a) Each PACT contract shall include, but shall not 3 be limited to, the following terms: "(1) The amount and the number of contract payments 4 5 required from a purchaser on behalf of a designated 6 beneficiary. 7 "(2) The terms and conditions under which purchasers shall remit contract payments, including, but not limited to, 8 9 the date or dates upon which each contract payment shall be 10 due. "(3) Provisions for late payment charges and for 11 default. 12 13 "(4) Provisions for withdrawal from the PACT Program, including refunds and any withdrawal penalty 14 15 therefor. "(5) The name and date of birth of the designated 16 17 beneficiary on whose behalf a contract is drawn. 18 "(6) Terms and conditions under which another person 19 may be subsequently substituted for the designated beneficiary 20 originally named. 21 "(7) The name of the person entitled to terminate 22 the PACT contract, the terms and conditions under which a PACT 23 contract may be terminated, and the name of the person 24 entitled to any refund due as a result of termination of a 25 PACT contract. "(8) The period of time during which the designated 26 beneficiary must claim benefits through the PACT Program. 27

"(9) The number of credit hours contracted for by
 the purchaser.

3 "(10) All other rights and obligations of the4 purchaser and the PACT Program.

5 "(11) Such other Other terms, conditions, and 6 provisions as the board considers in its sole discretion to be 7 necessary or appropriate.

8 "(b) In the event a designated beneficiary is 9 accepted by and elects to attend a college or university 10 outside the State of Alabama, the PACT board shall, upon 11 receipt of evidence of admission to the college or university, 12 <u>shall</u> remit contract benefits pursuant to the terms of the 13 PACT contract.

14 "(c) A PACT contract shall also specifically provide 15 that, if after ten 12 years following the designated beneficiary's college entrance date or the actual entrance 16 17 date of a designated beneficiary who is an accelerated 18 student, neither the PACT contract has been terminated nor the designated beneficiary's rights under the contract exercised, 19 20 the PACT board, after making reasonable effort to locate the 21 purchaser, shall presume the contract purchase amount 22 unclaimed and abandoned property, and thereafter administered in accordance with the Alabama Uniform Disposition of 23 24 Unclaimed Property Act, Article 2 of Chapter 12 of Title 35.

"(d) Nothing in this chapter, nor in a PACT contract
entered into pursuant to this chapter, shall be construed as a
promise or guarantee by the PACT board or the state that: A

person shall be admitted to a particular college or university; or that a person shall be allowed to continue to attend a college or university after having been admitted; or that a person shall be graduated from a college or university; or that Alabama resident status shall be conferred. Each state college or university shall establish its own residency requirements for matriculation.

8 "(e) The state or any state agency, or any county, 9 or municipality, or any other employer in the state is hereby 10 authorized, by contract, or otherwise, to agree with any 11 employee to remit contract payments through payroll deduction 12 made by the appropriate official of the state, state agency, 13 political subdivision, or other employer under the terms of an 14 accepted PACT contract."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
