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Relating to public utilities; to provide for the creation of a program through which the state may guarantee utility deposits for eligible participants.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) As used in this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- (1) COMMISSION. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education.
 - (2) ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANT. A graduate of an Alabama public or private college or university who satisfies all of the following:
 - a. Has been offered a full-time position, in writing, from an employer in the State of Alabama within 60 months of his or her graduation date.
 - b. Is in the process of establishing a new domicile within the State of Alabama for the purposes of that full-time employment, or has established a new domicile for those purposes within 30 days prior to the date of application.
 - (3) PROGRAM RECIPIENT. An eligible participant who meets all of the criteria set forth by rule by the Alabama Commission on Higher Education for participation in a utility guarantor program.
 - (4) UTILITY. An entity that offers electricity, natural gas, water, sewage, or trash collection services and requires a security deposit or guarantor for a new customer to

receive those services. The term does not include telecommunications or transportation-related utilities.

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- (5) UTILITY GUARANTOR PROGRAM or PROGRAM. A program through which the State of Alabama may guarantee utility deposits for eligible participants.
 - (b) The Alabama Commission on Higher Education shall establish and administer a utility guarantor program consistent with the requirements of this act. Any Alabama resident may apply to the commission to become a program recipient.
 - (c) Prior to enrollment in the program, the commission shall verify that an applicant is an eligible participant for the program and meets all of the criteria to become a program recipient.
 - (d) Upon verification that an applicant satisfies all criteria for the program, the commission shall issue one voucher to the program recipient for each of the program recipient's utilities declaring that the commission guarantees the utility deposits for that program recipient.
 - (1) Upon receipt of a valid voucher, a utility shall not require a utility deposit from that program recipient before beginning service.
 - (2) Each voucher shall only remain valid for one use and shall be collected, filed, and maintained by a utility at time of receipt.

1 (3) If the residence of a program recipient has two
2 or more meters for one type of utility service, the program
3 voucher shall only be valid for one meter.

- (e) If a program recipient defaults on a payment owed to a utility, the program shall reimburse the utility for that default, but shall not issue any future voucher for that type of utility for that program recipient. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the program shall honor any voucher with any utility that holds the program recipient in good standing.
- (f) If, after receiving a voucher for a utility deposit, a program recipient changes residences and is required to pay a new deposit for that same type of utility, the program shall not issue a voucher for that second deposit.
- (g) The use of a voucher by a program recipient does not guarantee service from any utility. Each eligible participant must also meet the criteria for initiating service of each utility.
- (h) The Alabama Commission on Higher Education shall maintain a list, electronically or otherwise, of all utilities that have agreed to allow the State of Alabama to serve as a guarantor under this act.
- Section 2. The Alabama Commission on Higher Education may adopt rules to implement and administer this act.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
