22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 12-19-210, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	is amended to read as follows:
25	"§12-19-210.
26	" (a) Regular jurors, grand and petit, shall be
27	entitled to \$10.00 receive ten dollars (\$10) as an expense

allowance for each day's services, \$.05 the state mileage rate, as determined by the state Comptroller, for each mile traveled in going to and returning from court, and ferriage and toll, to be proved by the oath of the juror before the clerk of the court. The clerk shall give each juror a certificate, stating therein the number of days he or she has served, the number of miles he or she has traveled, the amount of ferriage and toll he or she has paid, and the amount of expense allowance to which he or she is entitled. The certificate shall be payable out of the State Treasury.

(b) The provisions of this section shall be retroactive to May 23, 1977."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
