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8	Relating to energy services; to provide that no
9	governmental entity may prohibit a person or entity from using
10	utility services from a provider that is capable of providing
11	service and is otherwise authorized to do business in this

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. $\frac{\text{(a)}}{\text{(a)}}$ For the purposes of this section, the
15	following terms shall have the following meanings:
16	(1) GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. The state or any political
17	subdivision thereof, or any executive or legislative
18	department, unit, agency, board, commission, or authority of
19	the state, or any political subdivision, or any public
20	corporation, authority, agency, board, commission, or other
21	governmental entity controlled by the state or by any
22	political subdivision of the state.
23	(2) POLICY. Any requirement or prohibition contained
24	in an ordinance, resolution, regulation, code, proclamation or
25	any other requirement adopted by a governmental entity that is
26	on its face enforceable or intended to be enforced or any
27	practice or mandate undertaken in pursuance thereof by a

governmental entity against any person, entity, or corporation or other governmental entity providing utility energy service.

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- (3) UTILITY ENERGY SERVICE. The retail or wholesale sale or provision of energy service, whether in the form of electricity, natural gas, fuel oil, propane, methane, ethanol, or other fuel, by a person, firm, or corporation engaged in the business of providing such service.
- (b) No governmental entity or its governing body, officer, agent, or employee thereof, shall adopt, proclaim, or enforce any policy that prohibits, or has the effect of prohibiting, the provision or purchase of utility energy service or the connection or reconnection of piping or wiring, equipment, motor, or appliances used or usable for the purpose of utilizing any utility energy service to or by any person for retail or wholesale use based upon the form or type of utility energy service, source of energy therefor, or fuel used therefor.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall limit the ability of a governmental entity to select, install, or operate utility energy services of such type as it may choose for properties owned or operated by or for the benefit of the governmental entity.
- (d) This section does not apply to the provision or purchase of utility energy service by any utility or utility system established and operated by a municipality under Chapter 50 of Title 11, Code of Alabama 1975.

1	(2) UTILITY SERVICE. Electrical, natural gas, or
2	propane gas service provided to an end user.
3	Section 2. Except as otherwise provided in this act,
4	no governmental entity may adopt an ordinance, resolution,
5	regulation, or policy that prohibits, or has the effect of
6	restricting, a person's or entity's ability to use a utility
7	service of a provider that is authorized to do business in
8	this state.
9	Section 3. Nothing in this act shall be construed as
10	affecting a governmental entity's authority to do the
11	<pre>following:</pre>
12	(1) Exercise existing police powers to review and
13	approve an application before issuing building permits or to
14	otherwise enforce building, fire, and other public safety
15	codes. Provided, however, no governmental entity may deny a
16	building permit application based solely on the type of
17	utility service proposed for the project.
18	(2) License or permit a provider of a utility
19	service, or regulate the use of rights-of-way by a provider of
20	a utility service, in accordance with existing law. Provided,
21	however, no governmental entity may deny a license or permit
22	based solely on the type of utility service provided by the
23	provider.
24	(3) Regulate the permitting, safe handling, storage,
25	or use of propane gas.
26	$\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{Section 4.}}$ Nothing in this section shall be
27	deemed to affect the rules of the Alabama Public Service

Commission adopted in accordance with its powers under Title
37, Code of Alabama 1975. This section does not limit or
restrict the power or authority of a utility to take action
pursuant to any rules of the commission or the practices
established under the rules.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the

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first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
