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25	Relating to firefighting agencies; to amend Section
26	36-32-7, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide that paramedics

1	employed by a firefighting agency of a Class 1 municipality
2	are exempt from certain physical fitness requirements.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
4	Section 1. Section 36-32-7, Code of Alabama 1975, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"§36-32-7.
7	"(a) Applicability. The minimum standards provided
8	in this section shall apply to trainees who are to be employed
9	as fire-protection fire protection personnel by a public
10	fire-fighting firefighting agency. No city or fire-fighting
11	<u>firefighting</u> agency which <u>that</u> provides fire protection to the
12	public shall permanently employ any trainee as fire-protection
13	fire protection personnel who has not met the requirements of
14	this section. Provided, however, no fire prevention inspector,
15	fire protection engineer, paramedic, public fire and life
16	safety educator, public safety dispatcher, or person whose
17	duties are solely clerical or secretarial in nature employed
18	as fire-protection fire protection personnel by the
19	fire-fighting firefighting agency of any Class 1 municipality
20	shall be required to meet the minimum physical requirements as
21	a trainee for firefighter as prescribed by the commission.
22	"(b) Employment and qualifications. The <u>A</u> trainee
23	shall be certified by a licensed practicing physician as
24	satisfactory by the appointing authority designated as in good
25	health and physically fit for the performance of his duties as
26	a firefighter and shall meet the employment qualifications of

27 the appointing authority.

1 "(c) Training.(1) FIRE-PROTECTION PERSONNEL. Prior 2 to permanent employment, or a period not exceeding 12 months after the date of employment, the trainee shall have met the 3 requirements for certification as prescribed by the 4 5 commission. Training shall be given by an instructor certified by the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education 6 7 Commission and the training may be administered within the 8 department in which the applicant seeks to serve, if the 9 department meets the requirements of the commission for a 10 training center. Upon the completion of training, the commission shall administer a comprehensive written test to 11 12 each applicant; and each applicant must shall pass the test as 13 a condition of completion of such the training.

14 "(2) **VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER.** A volunteer firefighter 15 may be certified by the commission as a volunteer firefighter 16 if the volunteer firefighter shall have has met the training 17 requirements prescribed by the commission. Provided, and the 18 training is conducted by an instructor certified by and in facilities approved by the commission. The training need not 19 20 be during continuous sessions but may be scheduled at 21 different intervals during a period not exceeding 24 months 22 for a total of 160 hours. This subdivision shall not be 23 construed as to mandate training for volunteer firefighters, 24 except for purposes of certification."

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 26 first day of the third month following its passage and 27 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
