19	of sales and use taxes in the county; to make further
20	provision for the duties and operation of the Tuscaloosa
21	County Road Improvement Commission and the commitment by the
22	commission of tax proceeds.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Sections 11 and 11A of Act 56 of the 1953
25	Regular Session (Acts 1953, p. 76), as amended by Act 94-535
26	of the 1994 Regular Session (Acts 1994, p. 976), Act 94-554,
27	1994 Regular Session (Acts 1994, p. 1010), and Act 2015-202 of

1 the 2015 Regular Session (Acts 2015, p. 596), are amended to 2 read as follows:

3

"Section 11.

"(a) Any and all expenses, including (but without 4 limitation to), but not limited to, salaries, office rent, and 5 6 other expenses that may be necessary to provide for the 7 collection and distribution of the taxes herein levied as may be authorized or approved by the tax board, shall be deducted 8 9 by the tax board and paid out of the proceeds from collections 10 under this act before any distribution of proceeds. Provided, however, that under no circumstances shall the funds held or 11 collected pursuant to Sections 3A and 4A of this act be 12 13 commingled with other funds held or collected by the tax board, but shall be separately invested and accounted for and 14 15 all the expenses shall be charged against the proceeds 16 distributed to each recipient in proportion to the amount of 17 proceeds distributed. After deduction of expenses, the tax 18 board shall distribute the remaining proceeds from the taxes collected under this act as follows: 19

20 "(1) No later than November 30 of each fiscal year, 21 sums sufficient to satisfy all pledges of tax proceeds 22 collected under this act that were entered into on or before 23 April 1, 2015, shall be paid to the general fund of the city 24 City of Tuscaloosa, the City of Northport, the county, the 25 hospital authority, the county school system, and the city City of Tuscaloosa school system, as applicable, for payment 26 pursuant to such pledges; however, no sums may be distributed 27

pursuant to this subdivision in excess of the distribution that the recipient would have received under this act as in effect before the 2015 amendment to the this act.

"(2) No later than November 30 of each fiscal year, 4 5 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be disbursed to 6 the general fund of each of the municipalities of Lakeview, 7 Brookwood, Vance, Coaling, and Coker for general municipal 8 purposes. This disbursement shall be made after the distribution made pursuant to subdivision (1) and before any 9 10 other distribution is made pursuant to subdivisions (3) to (9), inclusive. 11

"(3) Nineteen percent of the net distributable
 amount, less and except any amounts paid to the city <u>City of</u>
 <u>Tuscaloosa</u> pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid to the
 <u>city City of Tuscaloosa</u> for general municipal purposes.

16 "(4) Five percent of the net distributable amount, 17 less and except any amounts paid to the City of Northport 18 pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid to the City of 19 Northport for general municipal purposes.

"(5) Fourteen and three-tenths percent of the net distributable amount, less and except any amounts paid to the county pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid to the county for general county purposes.

"(6) Six and seven-tenths percent of the net
distributable amount, less and except any amounts paid to the
hospital authority pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid
to the hospital authority, which shall use the proceeds solely

to defray all or a part of the costs of any hospital operated by the hospital authority for hospital services furnished to charity patients who are residents of the county, including any municipality therein.

5 "(7) Twenty-five percent of the net distributable 6 amount, less and except any amounts paid to the county school 7 system pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid to the county school system, which shall use the proceeds solely for 8 public school purposes in the county, including, but without 9 10 limitation not limited to, payment of any obligations of the county board of education which have heretofore or may 11 hereafter be issued for any public school purposes, together 12 13 with the interest thereon and the necessary expenses in connection with the issuance thereof, acquiring, providing, or 14 15 constructing schoolhouses and related buildings necessary or convenient for public school purposes, and equipping, 16 furnishing, maintaining, repairing, or replacing any buildings 17 18 and acquiring sites therefor, or any other general public school purposes. 19

"(8) Twenty percent of the net distributable amount, 20 21 less and except any amounts paid to the city City of 22 Tuscaloosa school system pursuant to subdivision (1), shall be paid to the city City of Tuscaloosa school system, which shall 23 24 use the proceeds solely for public school purposes in the city 25 City of Tuscaloosa, including, but without limitation to, 26 payment of any obligations of the city which have heretofore 27 or may hereafter be issued for any public school purposes,

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together with the interest thereon and the necessary expenses in connection with the issuance thereof, acquiring, providing, or constructing schoolhouses and related buildings necessary or convenient for public school purposes, and equipping, furnishing, maintaining, repairing, or replacing any such building and acquiring sites therefor, or any other general public school purposes.

8 "(9) All proceeds remaining shall be paid to, or at 9 <u>the written direction of</u>, the commission, for any application 10 <u>provided in this act</u>.

"(b) Tax proceeds shall be paid over to the 11 recipients thereof on or before the tenth day of the calendar 12 13 month next succeeding the calendar month in which the proceeds have been received by the tax board. The tax board is hereby 14 15 authorized to retain on hand at all times as a revolving or contingent fund for payment of its expenses, as provided for 16 in subsection (c) of Section 9, such amount of tax proceeds as 17 18 it deems expedient; provided, that as disbursements are made from the revolving or contingent fund, the tax board shall 19 20 have the power, immediately or at such times as it deems 21 convenient, to restore the moneys monies so disbursed out of the proceeds from the taxes herein levied; and provided 22 further, that the revolving or contingent fund shall not at 23 24 any time exceed 10 percent of the collections made under this 25 act during the then preceding calendar month.

"(c) The recipient of taxes under subsection (a) and
 recipients of appropriations by the commission, by appropriate

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proceedings, may appropriate, pledge, or enter into long-term contracts encumbering or restricting the use of the tax proceeds distributable to the recipient."

"Section 11A.

5 "(a) The Tuscaloosa County Road Improvement Commission is created to provide oversight for the 6 7 prioritization and financing of public road and bridge 8 construction and maintenance projects that are financed by the 9 tax proceeds allocated for use by the commission in accordance 10 with subdivision (9) of subsection (a) of Section 11 this act. The commission shall not constitute, and shall not have the 11 authority and powers of, a private or public corporation, body 12 13 politic, or political subdivision of the State of Alabama; 14 provided, all of the following:

15 "(1) That the commission shall constitute a 16 governmental body for purposes of Chapter 25A of Title 36, Code of Alabama 1975, and, for purposes of that chapter, the 17 18 commission may elect officers from its membership, a majority of members shall constitute a quorum for the authorization of 19 20 the performance of the duties of the commission under this 21 act, and the commission and its members shall have the same 22 immunity from liability as a municipality and officers of a 23 municipality.

24 "(2) That the commission may receive the proceeds of 25 the taxes collected under this act as provided in Section 26 11(a)(9) and act as custodian for those proceeds, for

1 <u>allocation and application as provided in this act and for no</u>
2 <u>other purpose.</u>

3	"(3) That the commission may execute, deliver, and
4	perform agreements, commitments, and obligations the
5	commission determines necessary or required by law to provide
6	for the application of the tax proceeds allocated to or at the
7	direction of the commission for purposes of this act, and the
8	commission may exercise powers in aid of or necessary to
9	perform its duties under this act.
10	"(4) That the commission may perform any of its
11	duties under this act without consent of, filing with, or
12	notice to, the State of Alabama or any agency, board,
13	corporation, or department thereof.
14	"(5) That the commission and all funds held by the
15	commission or allocated at the direction of the commission are
16	exempt from all taxation by the State of Alabama and any
17	taxing authority of the state. Title to any property financed
18	or purchased by the proceeds of the taxes allocated to or at
19	the direction of the commission shall pass to and vest in the
20	governmental authority having jurisdiction over the property
21	immediately upon acquisition of the property.
22	"(6) That all agreements, commitments, and
23	obligations made or undertaken by the commission in
24	furtherance of the purposes of this act and which, on the date
25	of adoption of the amendatory act adding this language, are in
26	effect and are not the subject of judicial proceedings in any
27	court of proper jurisdiction are ratified and confirmed.

1 "(b) The commission shall be composed of the 2 following members:

"(1) The Mayor of the City of Tuscaloosa, or his or
her appointee, who shall be a resident of the city <u>City of</u>
<u>Tuscaloosa</u> and serve a term of office coextensive with the
term of office of the mayor of the city <u>Mayor of the City of</u>
<u>Tuscaloosa</u> making the appointment. The acceptance or
appointment shall be evidenced by an instrument signed by the
mayor of the city and delivered to the commission.

"(2) The Mayor of the City of Northport, or his or
her appointee, who shall be a resident of the City of
Northport and serve a term of office coextensive with the term
of office of the Mayor of the City of Northport making the
appointment. The acceptance or appointment shall be evidenced
by an instrument signed by the Mayor of the City of Northport
and delivered to the commission.

17 "(3) The Chair chair of the Tuscaloosa County 18 Commission, or his or her appointee, who shall be a resident 19 of the county and serve a term of office coextensive with the 20 term of office of the chair. The acceptance or appointment 21 shall be evidenced by an instrument signed by the chair and 22 delivered to the commission.

"(4) One member appointed by the West Alabama
Chamber of Commerce, who shall be a resident of the county and
shall serve a term of office of four years from the date of
appointment. The appointment shall be evidenced by an

instrument signed by the chair of the chamber of commerce and
 delivered to the commission.

3 "(5) The Executive Director of the Tuscaloosa County
4 Industrial Development Authority, or his or her appointee, who
5 shall serve a term of office of four years from the date of
6 appointment. The acceptance or appointment shall be evidenced
7 by an instrument signed by the executive director and
8 delivered to the commission.

9 "(6) One member of the Tuscaloosa County Legislative 10 Delegation, selected by a majority of the members of the 11 delegation, who shall be a minority and a resident of the 12 county and serve a term of office coextensive with the term of 13 office of the members of the delegation. The selection shall 14 be evidenced by an instrument signed by a majority of the 15 members of the delegation and delivered to the commission.

16 "(7) One member of the Tuscaloosa County Legislative 17 Delegation, selected by a majority of the members of the 18 delegation, who shall be a resident of the county and serve a 19 term of office coextensive with the term of office of the 20 members of the delegation. The selection shall be evidenced by 21 an instrument signed by a majority of the members of the 22 delegation and delivered to the commission.

"(8) The Director of the Alabama Department of Transportation, or his or her appointee, who shall serve in an ex officio, unofficial, advisory, and nonvoting capacity and shall serve a term of office coextensive with the term of office of the Governor. The acceptance or appointment shall be

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evidenced by an instrument signed by the director of the
 department and delivered to the commission.

"(c) The commission shall apply the tax proceeds 3 received under this act in the following priority, with the 4 5 scope and the amount to be provided for each project to be determined by the commission, in its sole discretion. The 6 7 commission, consistent with the following priorities, may appropriate, convey, and transfer funds to the county, the 8 city City of Tuscaloosa, the City of Northport, the Alabama 9 10 Highway Authority, the Alabama Transportation Infrastructure Bank, the Alabama Department of Transportation, or other 11 appropriate governmental bodies solely for the purpose of 12 13 funding roads and highways in the county. The commission shall endeavor to fully fund each project, or the obligations issued 14 15 to fund each project, in a timely manner, after taking into account other funding sources from the state or federal 16 government. The commission is under no obligation to fully 17 18 fund each project listed below before moving to the next project listed: 19

"(1) Funds sufficient for the reimbursement of that portion of the City of Northport, Alabama General Obligation Warrants Series 2014-A, in the original amount of sixteen million five hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$16,520,000), issued on July 21, 2014, that is used for improvements to Mitt Lary Road, determined as follows:

26 "a. The amount needed to defease the debt service on27 that portion of the warrants; or

"b. An amount needed to defease 10 percent of such 1 2 amount each year for 10 years or, if sooner, until the warrants have been fully paid or defeased; or 3 "c. The annual debt service on such portion of the 4 5 warrants until the same are paid in full or defeased. 6 "(2) Improvements to SR69 South. 7 "(3) Improvements to SR69 North including, but not 8 limited to, the intersection of Highway 43 and 69; however, this shall not include any part of the Mitt Lary Road warrant 9 10 reimbursement identified in subdivision (1). "(4) Martin Luther King Boulevard/Jack Warner 11 12 Parkway improvements. 13 "(5) Improvements to McFarland Boulevard/U.S. 82, 14 however, excluding any projects which have begun, for which a 15 bid has been let, or for which funds have been encumbered for county projects on or before the effective date of the act 16 17 adding this section. 18 "(6) Improvements to McWright's Ferry Road. "(7) Improvements to the Bear Creek Cutoff Road. 19 20 "(d) Any tax proceeds remaining after the 21 construction of or the repayment of any obligations issued for 22 the projects prescribed in subdivisions (1) to (7), inclusive, of subsection (c) shall be allocated as follows: 23 24 "(1) Seventy-five percent to be administered by the 25 commission for significant roadway infrastructure projects to be identified and prioritized by the commission. 26

"(2) Twenty-five percent to the county and to each 1 2 municipality located therein, in proportion to population, with the population of the county to be determined for this 3 purpose net of the populations of the municipalities located 4 5 therein, to be administered by the county or municipalities, respectively, for local roadway infrastructure projects to be 6 7 determined by the county or municipalities in their sole discretion. For a municipality situated in both the county and 8 another county, only the population of the municipality 9 10 residing within the county shall be considered for purposes of this subdivision. 11

12 "(d) (e) The commission may bind itself by funding 13 agreement, indenture, resolution, or other appropriate 14 instrument to make appropriations in amounts specified by 15 dollar amount or formula in future years, and may bind future 16 road improvement boards by such means. However, the road 17 improvement board is not obligated and may not obligate itself 18 to pay more than it receives from the tax board. The recipient 19 of any appropriations may pledge or otherwise commit or 20 encumber such appropriations in accordance with law. apply any 21 or all of the tax proceeds received under this act directly for the purposes of this act, including, but not limited to, 22 23 either of the following:

24 "(1) The commission may appropriate, convey, and
25 transfer, from time to time or on a continuing basis, and
26 solely for use for the purposes of and as provided in this
27 act, any or all of the tax proceeds received by the commission

7	and pledge in succession any or all of the tax proceeds for
8	the benefit of any obligations issued or incurred, pursuant to
9	any laws other than this act, to finance the acquisition and
10	construction of any of the projects described in subsection
11	(c) and subdivision (d)(1).
12	"(f) The taxes levied by this act shall continue in
13	full force and effect for such time and at such rates, and the
14	proceeds shall be allocated and disbursed to the commission at
15	such times and in such amounts, as shall enable the commission
16	to make all appropriations and payments of proceeds at the
17	times and in the amounts required by any agreements,
18	commitments, pledges, and obligations made by the commission
19	pursuant to this act and at any time in effect."
20	Section 2. The provisions of this act are severable.
21	If any part of this act is declared invalid or
22	unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
23	which remains.
24	Section 3. This act shall become effective
25	immediately following its passage and approval by the
26	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
