To amend Section 41-5A-11, Code of Alabama 1975,

relating to the chief legal counsel and assistant legal

counsels of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts; to

remove the requirement that they be deputy attorneys general;

to provide further for their employment, duties, and powers;

and to provide further for the role of the chief examiner and

the Legislative Committee on Public Accounts.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 41-5A-11 of the Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$41-5A-11.

- "(a) The chief examiner shall appoint a chief legal counsel for the department pursuant to subsection (b) of Section 36-15-5.1 who shall serve at the pleasure of the chief examiner and perform those duties and exercise those powers as the chief examiner may direct. The chief legal counsel shall receive compensation in an amount determined by the chief examiner from funds available to the department.
- "(b) The chief legal counsel shall be of good character and qualified by training and experience to perform the duties of his or her office. The chief legal counsel shall be a licensed attorney authorized to practice law in this state.
- "(c) The chief examiner may appoint two assistant legal counsels for the department pursuant to subsection (b) of Section 36-15-5.1, and may appoint additional assistant legal counsels, as approved by the Legislative Committee on

Public Accounts. The assistant legal counsels for the

department shall be commissioned as assistant attorneys

general, but shall devote their entire time to the affairs of

the department serve and be compensated in the same manner as

the chief legal counsel under subsection (a).

"(d) Under the direction of the chief examiner and in consultation with the Legislative Committee on Public Accounts, the chief legal counsel and any assistant legal counsels may institute any civil action or other proceeding as necessary for the chief examiner to perform his or her duties and protect the rights and interests of the department under this chapter. The chief legal counsel and assistant legal counsels, though under the sole direction of the chief examiner, shall be vested with the same powers, privileges, and rights afforded a deputy attorney general."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
